NOTICE OF ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE LISTENING SESSION ON STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD EFFORTS TO UPDATE AND IMPLEMENT THE WATER QUALITY CONTROL PLAN FOR THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY/SACRAMENTO-SAN JOAQUIN DELTA ESTUARY

State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board or Board) staff will hold a public listening session on Wednesday, June 7, 2023, to receive input from representatives of environmental justice organizations, economically disadvantaged communities (DACs); and black, indigenous, and people of color (BIPOC) community members and individuals on the Board's current efforts to update and implement the Water Quality Control Plan for the San Francisco Bay/Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Estuary (Bay-Delta Plan), including consideration of possible Voluntary Agreements for those update and implementation efforts. During the listening session, responses will be provided to questions and comments received at a prior environmental justice focused Bay-Delta planning and implementation listening session held on March 27, 2023. State Water Board staff will also present on the Board's Bay-Delta planning and implementation efforts. Staff from the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) and California Department of Water Resources (DWR) will then provide information on Voluntary Agreements for possible updates to the Bay-Delta Plan. Participants will then have the opportunity to provide feedback and input in smaller group break out discussions. A frequently asked questions document will be released prior to the listening session. A quorum of the Board may be present, but no action will be taken.

The listening session will primarily occur in small group discussions (breakout rooms), where participants will be asked to identify environmental justice issues that the Board should consider when updating and implementing the Bay-Delta Plan. Input may be provided generally and specifically related to any of the current processes the Board is undertaking to consider updates and implementation measures for the Bay-Delta Plan. Board staff will provide a summary of the small-group comments to the larger group and Board Members in attendance. Following the small group reports, individuals will also be provided the opportunity to provide direct comments.

BACKGROUND

Protecting the Bay-Delta watershed is one of the State Water Board's primary responsibilities and top priorities. The State Water Board is responsible for adopting and updating the Bay-Delta Plan, which identifies beneficial uses of water in the Bay-Delta watershed, water quality objectives for the reasonable protection of those beneficial uses, and a program of implementation to achieve the objectives.

The Bay-Delta watershed is a critical part of California's water supply system and provides habitat for fish, wildlife, and species with high ecological, economic, and cultural importance. Native species in the Bay-Delta ecosystem are experiencing significant declines due to habitat conversion, degraded water quality, reductions in flows, changes in the timing and distribution of flows, and the inability to access natal

habitats blocked by dams and levees. The State Water Board is actively working to address many of these issues through the update and implementation of the Bay-Delta Plan.

The Bay-Delta Plan is currently in the process of being updated and implemented through separate processes. In December 2018, the State Water Board adopted Bay-Delta Plan amendments focused on Lower San Joaquin River flows for the protection of fish and wildlife and southern Delta salinity for the protection of agriculture. In July 2022, the State Water Board issued a Notice of Preparation (NOP) of a draft environmental impact report needed to support a proposed regulation to implement the 2018 Bay-Delta Plan updates. Separately, the State Water Board is also considering possible updates to the 2018 amendments to the Bay-Delta Plan that would be needed for a proposed Voluntary Agreement for the Tuolumne River. In April 2023, an NOP was issued for preparation of a draft Staff Report/Substitute Environmental Document needed to support possible amendments to the Bay-Delta Plan.

The State Water Board is also considering updates to the Bay-Delta Plan focused on the Sacramento River and its tributaries, Delta eastside tributaries (including Calaveras, Cosumnes, and Mokelumne rivers), interior Delta flows, and Delta outflows (Sacramento/Delta updates to the Bay-Delta Plan). Currently, the State Water Board is developing a draft Staff Report/Substitute Environmental Document in support of possible Sacramento/Delta updates to the Bay-Delta Plan. The draft Staff Report/Substitute Environmental Document evaluates project alternatives, including a potential Voluntary Agreement alternative. The draft Staff Report/Substitute Environmental Document is anticipated to be released for public review and comment in summer of 2023.

The State Water Board is interested in receiving additional input on environmental justice issues that should be evaluated and considered during the above planning and implementation processes.
