BACKGROUND

The State Water Board is implementing the Safe and Affordable Funding for Equity and Resilience (SAFER) Drinking Water Program with a set of tools, funding sources, and regulatory authorities designed to ensure that the approximately one million Californians who currently lack safe drinking water receive safe and affordable drinking water as soon as possible.

The SAFER Program is responsible for conducting an annual Needs Assessment, which consists of three components: (1) Affordability Assessment, (2) Risk Assessment, and (3) Cost Assessment. Results of the Needs Assessment are used to inform the prioritization of projects in the annual Fund Expenditure Plan for the Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Fund.

The State Water Board's Needs Analysis Unit in the Division of Drinking Water leads the implementation of the Needs Assessment in coordination with the Division of Water Quality (DWQ) and Division of Financial Assistance (DFA).

PURPOSE

This workshop will provide an opportunity for stakeholders to learn about and contribute to the State Water Board's proposed updates to the Cost Assessment Model for estimating interim and/or emergency measures and long-term solutions for failing public water systems, at-risk public water systems, at-risk state small water systems, and domestic wells.

Specifically, this workshop will focus on the methods and cost assumptions associated with estimating other essential infrastructure needs and managerial support through an Administrator and/or technical assistance and providing interim and/or emergency measures.

The State Water Board will be hosting the last of three workshops in 2023 to solicit public input on enhancements and updates to the Cost Assessment Model:

- Workshop 1: Physical consolidation GIS analysis and cost assumptions
- Workshop 2: Modeled treatment methodologies and cost assumptions
- Workshop 3: Other Essential Infrastructure, Administrative Needs, and Interim Solutions.
