# 8. Consideration of a resolution concerning the Los Osos Community Services District State Revolving Fund Loan (Project No. C-06-4014-110)

Water Board staff, Mr. Polhemus, Division of Financial Assistance, presented the item to the Board. He gave a brief review of recent highlights with Los Osos Wastewater Projects and its SRF loans:

- January 20, 2005: State Water Board approved the preliminary loan commitment for the Los Osos Project.
- May 20, 2005: The Division of Financial Assistance (DFA) issued an approval to award setting the project budget based on bids received for the project and appropriate allowances at approximately 135 million dollars.
- August 8, 2005: The State Revolving Fund (SRF) installment sales agreement (loan contract) for the project was executed.
- August 22, 2005: Los Osos Community Services District issued its' notice to proceed to the construction contractors and began constructing the project.
- September 27, 2005: The voters of Los Osos Community Services District (LOCSD) recalled 3 of their Board members and passed Measure B. Measure B required all work to stop on the current treatment plant and dictated that a new site, outside of the town of Los Osos, be located. It also set up conditions of approval for the new site, including a majority vote requirement for approval of any new location.
- October 6, 2005: The Los Osos Community Service District suspended work on its construction contracts.
- October 18, 2005: DFA issued a notice of withholding of all future loan repayments. To date, DFA has disbursed \$6 million in loan funds and have received a request from the District for an additional \$6 million.

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October 21, 2005: At the request of Assemblyman Blakesley, discussions on how to move the project forward were held in San Lius Obispo. Mr. Polhemus participated in those discussions. Subsequent to those discussions, the District submitted a proposal to end construction of the current treatment plant and to move the site of the treatment facility out of Los Osos. Staff has reviewed this proposal and determined that the risks to the SRF Program and recovery of funds already spent on construction are too great. Staff requested that the Los Osos Community Services District resume work on the previously approved project.
