

Long Term Water Conservation


- 20x2020 Urban Water Conservation
- Baseline water use and water use targets reported in 2010 urban water management plans
- Many questions on state's progress



Tracking 20 x2020

Survey development

- Surveyed state, regional and individual water suppliers and organizations
- Received data for I47 water suppliers.
 - Provide water to 22 million or roughly 60% of the State's population
 - Avg baseline GPCD = 191 compared to State avg of 196
 - Plan to request data from additional water suppliers





DWR/State Facility Drought Response Activities



Drought Landscaper workshops

- Partnership with UC Davis, local agencies and irrigation companies
- Emphasis on managing large landscape during drought
- English and Spanish
- 375 attendees at 3 workshops
- 6 more workshops scheduled





Small water system workshops

- partnership with California Rural Water
 Association
- 3 leak detection workshops with 70 attendees, 2 more planned
- 3 drought preparedness workshops with 87 attendees, 2 more planned





Landscape Symposia


- Goal of making sustainable landscapes the "default/normal" landscape in CA.
- Sponsored by CUWCC and 4 state agencies
- Northern and Southern California meetings with 400 attendees






Drought Water Rate Structure Webinar

- Partnership with ACWA
- 200 Attendees





Drought Grant Funding

- \$200M IRWM Drought Funding
 - Applications due July 21, 2014
- \$19M Water/Energy Drought Funds
 - o Draft Guidelines planned for release on July 1st.

State Facilities Drought Response

- Agency and department water use reported monthly
- State facilities are limiting or eliminating landscape irrigation, vehicle washing
