**Subject:** Comment Letter – Cambria WDR Update

My wife and I bought property in Cambria in 1983, but because of water restrictions did not receive permission to build until 1999. Water availability has always been an important and dividing issue in the community. The Cambria Community Services District (CCSD) took a brave step in building the emergency water project during our most recent devastating drought. There are still a small number of members of the community who do not want the plant to operate and are willing to condemn Cambria to an uncertain water future.

I read the Cambria WDR update, and strongly support Draft Order No. R3-2014-0050 for the Emergency Water Treatment Facility and Recycled Water Re-injection Project. This will allow the CCSD to apply to the County of San Luis Obispo for a permanent operating permit to provide a sustainable water supply during future droughts.

Please do not let a small vocal minority of opposition voices slow or stop approval of this updated plan. We need the project completed and permitted for permanent use. It is our best chance for future water security and community sustainability.
