**Subject: Cambria WDR Update – Order No. R3-2014-0050**

Dear Mr. Rokke,

I am Mel McColloch, President of the Cambria Chamber of Commerce. I represent the largest majority of our 350 members in my comments.

I am writing to express my support for proposed updates of Order No. R3-2014-0050, Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) and Waste Recycling Requirements (WRRs) for the Cambria CSD Emergency Water Treatment Facility and Recycled Water Re-Injection Project.

It is very important that we ensure a sustainable water supply by having our plant fully permitted. Cambria's SWF will serve no more than a total of 4,650 homes, this includes the CCSD wait list. The limit has been adopted in the CCSD 2008 master plan and is referenced in the north coast area plan.

The plant protects habitat for wild life species by protecting the San Simeon Creek Lagoon during dry weather. It will also help to stop Sea water intrusion into our well fields. It will ensure water self-sufficiency to address local fire protection which is needed. Because our community is so heavily forested,

There many more reasons for our SWF to be fully permitted and we ask that you do this.
