I didn't realize that I could email you with my feelings on the Los Osos wastewater treatment facility without fear of some sort of retaliatory punishment threat.

I say this because a month ago I emailed you with three questions. I didn't receive a reply so I re-emailed you and this time with a copy to Tam Doduc. You replied that Sorrel Marks would contact me. To date since your email, I have not heard from her and a month has passed.

However, I was very upset in that we had spoken on the phone and you chose to send a copy of my email to Harvey Packard, Supervisor of the CCRWQCB Enforcement Division. I took this to be an individual threat or more explicitly a form of selective enforcement threat.

I am asking if names of the individuals, who wrote any of the 100 letters on ACL List ,were also turned over to Mr. Packard. And if not, why not? And why was I signaled out?

I would love to exercise my right of freedom of speech, but feel tremendously threatened by your action. And probably there are many, many others who fear threats of retaliation if they voice their opinion.

Hoping to hear from you and not Harvey Packard.
