COMPLAINT NO. R3-2005-0009 FOR MANDATORY MINIMUM PENALTIES IN THE MATTER OF CITY OF PISMO BEACH WASTEWATER FACILITY, SAN LUIS OBISPO COUNTY

Attached is Complaint for Mandatory Minimum Penalty No. R3-2005-0009 (Complaint). The Complaint is based on violations of effluent limitations in Waste Discharge Requirements Order No. 99-31 and R3-2004-0051/National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit No. CA0003743, occurring between July 2001 and November 2004. The Complaint specifies the occurrence dates and nature of the violations.

We will present an Order to the Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Coast Region (Regional Board) for the amount proposed in the Complaint (\$351,000) at the Regional Board meeting on March 25, 2005, at the Regional Board Conference Room, 895 Aerovista Place, Suite 101, San Luis Obispo, California. The meeting is scheduled to begin at 8:30 a.m.; however, no specific time has been set for consideration of this item.

In this case, California Water Code Section 13385(1) allows a portion of the penalty amount (\$183,000) to be expended on a supplemental environmental project (SEP) in accordance with the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB)'s Enforcement Policy. You may submit a proposal for one or more SEPs. If you do choose to submit a proposal, please submit it for consideration no later than February 22, 2005. The State Water Resources Control Board's February 19, 2002 Water Quality Enforcement funding **SEP** must meet to qualify Policy specifies the criteria www.swrcb.ca.gov/plnspols/wqep.doc. 

# MANDATORY PENALTY IN THE MATTER OF CITY OF PISMO BEACH WASTEWATER FACILITY SAN LUIS OBISPO COUNTY

This complaint to assess Mandatory Penalties pursuant to Water Code section 13385(h) and (i) is issued to the City of Pismo Beach (Discharger) based on a finding of violations of Waste Discharge Requirements Order Nos. 99-31 and R3-2004-0051 (NPDES No. CA0048151).

The Executive Officer finds the following:

- 1. On July 12, 1999, the Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Coast Region (Regional Board) adopted Order No. 99-31 (NPDES No. CA0048151), Waste Discharge Requirements for the City of Pismo Beach, San Luis Obispo County and updated the requirements on September 10, 2004, by adoption of Order No. R3-2004-0051.
- 2. California Water Code section 13385(h)(1) requires the Regional Board to assess a mandatory penalty of three thousand dollars (\$3,000) for each serious violation.
- 3. California Water Code section 13385(h)(2) provides a serious violation occurs if the discharge exceeds the effluent limitations for a Group II pollutant (as specified in Appendix A to section 123.45 of Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations) by 20 percent or more, or for a Group I pollutant (as specified in Appendix A to section 123.45 of Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations) by 40 percent or more.
- 4. California Water Code section 13385(i) requires the Regional Board to assess a mandatory penalty of three thousand dollars (\$3,000) for each violation, not counting the first three violations, if the discharger does any of the following four or more times in a consecutive six-month period:
  - a) Exceeds a waste discharge requirement effluent limitation;
  - b) Fails to file a report pursuant to Section 13260;
  - c) Files an incomplete report pursuant to Section 13260; or
  - d) Exceeds a toxicity discharge limitation contained in the applicable waste discharge requirements where the waste discharge requirements do not contain pollutant-specific effluent limitations for toxic pollutants.
- 5. California Water Code section 13385(I) states that "(1) In lieu of assessing penalties pursuant to subdivision (h) or (i), the...regional board, with the concurrence of the discharger, may direct a portion of the penalty amount to be expended on a supplemental environmental project in accordance with the enforcement policy of the state board. If the penalty amount exceeds fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000), the portion of the penalty amount that may be directed to be expended on a supplemental environmental project may not exceed fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) plus 50 percent of the penalty amount that exceeds fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000)."

6. Order Nos. 99-31 and R3-2004-0051 include in part the following Effluent Limitations:

- 7. Biochemical Oxygen Demand (BOD, 5-day), Total Suspended Solids and Settleable Solids are Group I Pollutants. Fecal Coliform is not listed as a Group I or a Group II Pollutant.
- 8. Effluent containing constituent concentrations that are greater than serious thresholds (limit + 40% for Group I pollutants, limit + 20% for Group II pollutants) are serious violations. Fecal Coliform is neither a Group I nor a Group II pollutant, therefore it has no serious threshold.
- 9. Effluent containing BOD, Suspended Solids or Settleable Solids concentrations that are less than the serious threshold but greater than the permit limits, are chronic violations.
- 10. Effluent containing fecal coliform values that exceed a 7-day average (between September 1, 2001 and September 9, 2004) or 7-sample median (after September 10, 2004) of 200 MPN/100 ml or maximum of 2000 MPN/100 ml are chronic violations.
- 11. On May 13, 2004, the Central Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Board) issued an order (No. R3-2004-008) to the City of Pismo Beach (City) assessing mandatory minimum penalties (MMPs) in the amount of \$735,000 for violations of the effluent limits set forth above. All of the violations cited in the Complaint that resulted in Order No.R3-2004-0008 (Administrative Civil Liability Complaint No. R3-2003-050) were alleged as mandatory MMPs, and not as discretionary penalties under section 13385(c).
- 12. After the hearing, the City and the Regional Board continued to discuss the issues addressed in the Order No. R3-2004-0008. The City and Regional Board staff agreed that the City had over-reported violations of average limits and that the over-reporting resulted in the assessment of MMPs for reported violations that were not actually chronic violations for purposes of California Water Code Section 13385. The Regional Board's Executive Officer and the Discharger stipulated that the State Water Resources Control Board should vacate Order No. R3-2004-0008 so that the Executive Officer could reissue an administrative civil liability complaint with the MMPs calculated correctly. The correct calculations are set forth below. This Complaint amends and supercedes Complaint No. R3-2003-050. This Complaint also alleges violations that occurred subsequent to the issuance of Complaint No. R3-2003-050 (April 2003 through November 30, 2004).
- 13. According to monitoring reports submitted by the Discharger, the Discharger committed the following violations of Effluent Limitations specified in Order Nos. 99-31 and R3-2004-0051 during the period July 1, 2001 through November 30, 2004:

- 14. According to Finding No. 13, the Discharger committed forty two (42) "serious" violations in the period from July 1, 2001 to November 30, 2004. In accordance with California Water Code section 13385(h), the amount of mandatory penalty for the above serious violations (42 x \$3,000) is one hundred twenty six thousand dollars (\$126,000).
- 15. According to Finding No. 13, the Discharger committed seventy six (76) "chronic" violations in the period from July 1, 2001 to November 30, 2004. Violation No. 1 was preceded by greater than three violations within a six-month period prior to July 1, 2001 (addressed in Order No. 01-117), therefore each subsequent violation is subject to mandatory penalty. Violation No. 92 is preceded by less than three violations within a six-month period, therefore no mandatory penalty for Violation No. 92 is required. In accordance with California Water Code section 13385(i), the mandatory minimum penalty for the above listed chronic violations [(76 1) x \$3000] is two hundred twenty five thousand dollars (\$225,000).

16. The total amount of the mandatory penalty from July 1, 2001 to November 30, 2004 (\$126,000 + \$225,000) is three hundred fifty-one thousand dollars (\$351,000).

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#### THE CITY OF PISMO BEACH IS HEREBY GIVEN NOTICE THAT:

- 1. The Executive Officer of the Regional Board proposes that the Discharger be assessed a Mandatory Penalty in the amount of three hundred fifty-one thousand dollars (\$351,000).
- 2. The Regional Board shall hold a public hearing on March 25, 2005, unless the Discharger agrees to waive its right to a public hearing by filling out, signing and submitting the enclosed "Waiver of Hearing". If the Discharger chooses not to waive its right to a public hearing, the Regional Board may proceed with the scheduled public hearing and consider testimony received from interested persons during the public hearing and decide whether to accept the amount of Mandatory Penalty proposed by the Executive Officer. The Regional Board may also decide to continue the matter to a future hearing, direct the Executive Officer to reissue the Complaint to propose additional penalties under California Water Code section 13385(c) and (e), or refer the matter to the State Attorney General. The public hearing is scheduled at the regularly scheduled Regional Board meeting on March 25, 2005, at the Regional Board Conference Room, 895 Aerovista Place, Suite 101, San Luis Obispo, California. The meeting is scheduled to begin at 8:30 a.m.; however, no specific time has been set for consideration of this item.

# PROCEDURAL INFORMATION FOR MANDATORY MINIMUM PENALTY COMPLAINT PUBLIC HEARING AND PAYMENT

#### WAIVER OF HEARING

You may waive your right to a hearing. If you wish to waive the hearing, an authorized person must check and sign the waiver and return it to the Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Coast Region, 895 Aerovista Place, Suite 101, San Luis Obispo, California 93401-7906.

If you choose to waive the right to a hearing, the Executive Officer will present an Order for the amount of liability proposed in the Complaint to the Regional Board at the March 25, 2005 Regional Board meeting. The Regional Board may adopt or reject the Order. If the proposed Order is adopted, payment will be due and payable by April 24, 2005 (check payable to State Water Resources Control Board). If the Order is rejected, the Regional Board may direct the Executive Officer to issue a new complaint and schedule another hearing. The Regional Board may adopt the proposed Order on the consent calendar. If an interested member of the public or a Regional Board member removes the item from the consent calendar for any reason, the Regional Board will accept public testimony, consider the administrative record and conduct deliberations before deciding whether to adopt or reject the Order. If the Regional Board rejects the proposed Order, it may direct the Executive Officer to re-issue the Complaint to include discretionary penalties and provide you with an opportunity for a hearing on the reissued complaint.

If you do not waive your right to a hearing, the Regional Board will proceed with the scheduled hearing and consider testimony received from interested persons during the hearing and decide whether to accept the amount proposed by the Executive Officer or increase or decrease the liability. Liability may be increased up to the amount of maximum potential liability stated in this Complaint. The Board may also decide to continue the matter to a future hearing, direct the Executive Officer to reissue the Complaint in a higher amount or refer it to the State Attorney General.

You may submit a check for the proposed amount of liability prior to March 25, 2005. If the Regional Board does not adopt the proposed Order, your check will be returned to you.
