

Irrigated Lands Program Limited Resource Growers Self-Determination Tool Guide

Limited Resource Growers Self-Determination Tool Summary

This document provides instruction to growers on how to use the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Limited Resource Farmer/Rancher Self Determination Tool and the information is necessary to submit to the Central Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Coast Water Board) to qualify as a "Limited Resource Farmer or Rancher".

As defined by the USDA, the term "Limited Resource Farmer or Rancher" means a participant:

- With direct or indirect gross farm sales not more than the current indexed value in each of the previous two years, and
- Who has a total household income at or below the national poverty level for a family of four, or less than 50 percent of county median household income in each of the previous two years.


Under Order No. R3-2021-0040, General Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges from Irrigated Lands (Agricultural Order), the Central Coast Water Board recognizes that certain limited resource growers (as defined by the USDA) may have difficulty achieving compliance and will prioritize assistance for these growers, including but not limited to technical assistance, grant opportunities, and necessary flexibility to achieve compliance (Agricultural Order, page 8, paragraph 37).


How to Complete the Self-Assessment

Go to the Limited Resource Farmer/Rancher website: https://lrftool.sc.egov.usda.gov/.

Select the current Fiscal Year (FY) tool from the sidebar (i.e. FY 2023, as shown)




Complete each step shown in the image below:



Under "Step 1: Select your state from the list", select the state that you reside in, or that your ranch is located in.



Step 1: Select your state from the list.



Next, "Step 2: Select your county or area from the list", select the county or area that you live in, or where your ranch is located, consistent with the selection made in the previous step.

Step 2: Select your county or area from the list.



Then for "Step 3: Determine your Gross Farm and Income Levels", answer both questions by selecting yes or no. Prior years' tax information will be needed for both questions, including values for Gross Farm Sales and Total Household Income (Adjusted Gross Income Section on IRS form 1040).

An example for San Luis Obispo County is shown below.

Step 3: Determine your Gross Farm and Income Levels.

A. Gross Farm Sales Determination: In each of the tax years 2020 and 2021, was your direct or indirect Gross Farm Sales less than or equal to \$221,200 per year?	○ *Yes	O No
B. Adjusted Gross Income Determination: In each of the tax years 2020 and 2021, was your Total Household Income less than the SAN LUIS OBISPO County "County/Area Value" of \$41,805?	○ *Yes	O No
Total Household Income is defined as Adjusted Gross Income for all members in your household or the amount you entered on IRS Form 1040, Adjusted Gross Income Section. See IRS Web Site for more information on the IRS form. For FY 2023 Programs, this should be compared with your Adjusted Gross Income for 2020 and 2021.		
County/Area Value is calculated as the higher of the National Poverty level or 50% of the County/Area Median Household Income.		

The "County/Area Value" is the National Poverty level or 50% of the Median Household Income for the county selected, whichever is higher.


Finally, "Step 4: Print your results." Select "Print Results" to view USDA Limited Resource Farmer and Rancher FY Program Status / Income Determination. Select "Print" again to print and/or save a copy. Select "Close" when complete.



Include the Operation ID (AW#), a few sentences describing the flexibility needed to comply with the Agricultural Order requirements, and the best telephone number(s) to be reached at.

As described in the Agricultural Order, necessary flexibility to achieve compliance may include "adjusted monitoring, reporting, or time schedules." Please be prepared to discuss the flexibility needed with Irrigated Lands Program staff.


Language Barriers

Growers whose primary language is not English can receive Irrigated Lands Program information in their language by choosing a language preference in GeoTracker.:


2) Select "[EDIT OPERATION INFORMATION]"



3) At the top of the form, where is says "Language Preference", select the preferred language. If the language is not listed, select "Other" and enter the language.



4) After the language preference is selected, select "Save Changes" at the bottom of the form.
