PROJECT (WDID#5A34CR000745), SACRAMENTO COUNTY***

On 12 July 2018, DPS Construction & Engineering (Applicant) filed a notification requesting coverage under Water Quality Order No. 2004-0004-DWQ, Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements for Dredged or Fill Discharges to Waters Deemed by the Army Corps of Engineers to be Outside of Federal Jurisdiction (General Order). After review of the notification and the supplemental material submitted by the Applicant, the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) has determined that the project qualifies for enrollment under this General Order. The proposed activity will take place within less than 0.087 acre of waters of the State.

The Central Valley Water Board is enrolling this project under the Water Quality Order No. 2004-0004-DWQ, subject to the conditions and the notification requirements described in the General Order ("Discharge Requirements"). This Notice of Applicability is being issued under the General Order pursuant to § 3838 of the California Code of Regulations.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

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


Figure 1 – Site Map

The Morey & Morrison Project consists of constructing a 15.15-acre residential development with 136 single-family homes, associated infrastructure, utilities, and landscaping. Grading required for the Project will require the fill of 0.087 acre of seasonal wetlands (W1, W2, W3, and W-4 on Figure 1).
