ORDER AMENDING CLEAN WATER ACT SECTION 401 TECHNICALLY CONDITIONED WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION; CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION; I-5 NORTH STOCKTON CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENTS, PACKAGE 1 PROJECT (WDID#5B39CR00184A4), SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY

This Order responds to the 18 March 2019 request for an amendment of I-5 North Stockton Corridor Improvements, Package 1 Project (Project) Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WDID#5B39CR00184). The original Water Quality Certification (Certification) was issued on 2 July 2010 and amended on 9 November 2011, and 29 August 2014. The requested amendment is hereby approved. The original Certification is therefore amended as described below. Please attach this document to the original Certification.

AMENDMENT:

The California Department of Transportation is requesting an amendment to the original Certification to update the project description and impacts to reflect as-built conditions on-site.

The Certification is amended as shown in underline/strikeout format below.

Project Description (purpose/goal): The proposed bridge widening at Calaveras River and Fourteen Mile Slough will require the installation of 49 <u>64</u> piles into jurisdictional waters to widen the two bridges.

Bridge construction operations within aquatic habitats at the Calaveras River and Fourteen Mile Slough will be conducted <u>from a temporary floating barge and</u> with the use of temporary construction trestles.

Fill and Excavation Area: Approximately 128 cubic yards of permanent fill and 150 cubic yards of temporary fill will be placed into 0.096 acre of jurisdictional wetland and

1.064 1.034-acres of un-vegetated streambed, respectively. 487 cubic yards of rock slope protection (RSP) will permanently be placed into 0.0084 acre of waters of the United States. An additional 92 cubic yards of RSP will be placed into approximately 0.09 0.04-acre of river bed.

The total amount of impacts to waters of the United States authorized in this amended Certification includes $0.141 \\ 0.145$ -acre of permanent impacts and $1.16 \\ 1.13$ -acres of temporary impacts.

Compensatory Mitigation: Caltrans will mitigate at a 1:1 ratio for the permanent loss of 0.0127 acre and 0.5:1 ratio for temporary loss of 1.148 acres of waters of the United States, including indirect effects, Caltrans shall purchase 0.048 acre of wetland credits and 0.56 acres of open water credits at a United States Army Corps of Engineers approved mitigation bank. The selected mitigation bank shall include the area of the permitted project within its service area. To mitigate for the loss of 0.0084 acre of waters of the United States the California Department of Transportation will contribute funds of \$1,500.00 to the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation through an in-lieu fee agreement. To mitigate for the permanent impact to 0.042-acre of waters of the United States caltrans shall purchase a minimum of 0.042 floodplain mosaic wetlands credits from the Cosumnes Floodplain Mitigation Bank. At a minimum, compensatory mitigation must achieve a ratio of 1:1 for permanent impacts.

APPLICATION FEE RECEIVED:

Additional fees of \$1,638.00 were collected for this amendment. Total fees of \$13,424.00 for the original Certification and previous amendments were submitted to the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board. The fee amount was determined as required by California Code of Regulations, title 23, sections 3383(b)(3) and 2200(a)(3), as was calculated as category A - Fill & Excavation Discharges (fee code 84) with the dredge and fill fee calculator.
