ORDER AMENDING CLEAN WATER ACT SECTION 401 WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION AND ORDER; LENNAR WINNCREST, LLC AND BASELINE A&B HOLDINGS, LLC, PLACER VINEYARDS PROPERTY 19 DEVELOPMENT (INFRASTRUCTURE SEGMENT Q) PROJECT (WDID NO. 5A31CR00481A2), PLACER COUNTY

This Order responds to the 12 November 2021 request for an amendment of the Placer Vineyards Property 19 Development (Infrastructure Segment Q) Project Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WDID No. 5A31CR00481). The original Water Quality Certification (Certification) was issued on 24 June 2019. An amendment (WDID No. 5A31CR00481A1) was issued on 7 May 2021. The requested amendment is hereby approved, and the original Certification is therefore amended as described below. Please attach this document to the original Certification.

#### AMENDMENT:

Lennar Winncrest, LLC and Baseline A&B Holdings, LLC (hereinafter Permittee) are requesting an amendment to the Section 401 Water Quality Certification and Order to revise the mitigation type and quantity per the Placer County Conservation Program requirements. Therefore, Section XIV.K.3; Table 6; Table 7; and Attachment B, Table 3 and Table 4 are amended in underline format below.

### XIV.K Compensatory Mitigation for Permanent Impacts<sup>1</sup>

1. Compensatory Mitigation Plan: The Permittee shall provide compensatory mitigation for impacts to waters of the United States and waters of the state in accordance with Clean Water Act Section 404 Mitigation Strategy (Mitigation Strategy) for the Placer Vineyards Specific Plan (PVSP) dated 22 September 2015 and incorporated herein by reference. Any deviations from, or revisions to, the Mitigation Strategy for PVSP must be pre-approved by Central Valley Water Board staff. The monitoring period shall continue until the Central Valley Water Board staff determines that performance standards have been met. This may require the monitoring period to be extended.

# 2. Purchase of Mitigation Credits by Permittee for Compensatory Mitigation.

- A copy of the fully executed agreement for the purchase of mitigation credits shall be provided to the Central Valley Water Board prior to the initiation of in water work.
- b. The Permittee shall retain responsibility for providing the compensatory mitigation and long-term management until Central Valley Water Board staff has received documentation of the credit purchase and the transfer agreement between the Permittee and the seller of credits.

## 3. Total Required Compensatory Mitigation

#### a. Total Required Compensatory Mitigation for Phase Q1.1

- i. The Permittee is required to provide compensatory mitigation for the authorized impact to 2.784 acres of riverine seasonal wetlands by purchasing 4.176 acres of vernal pool complex credits from the Placer County Conservation Program In-Lieu Fee Program.
- ii. The Permittee is required to provide compensatory mitigation for the authorized impact to 0.209 acre of seasonal marsh by purchasing <u>0.314 acre of emergent marsh from the Placer County</u> Conservation Program In-Lieu Fee Program.
- iii. The Permittee is required to provide compensatory mitigation for the authorized impact to 1.085 acres of seasonal wetlands by purchasing <u>1.628 acres of vernal pool complex credits from the</u> <u>Placer County Conservation Program In-Lieu Fee Program.</u>
- iv. The Permittee is required to provide compensatory mitigation for the authorized impact to 2.374 acres of vernal pools by purchasing

- 3.562 acres of vernal pool credits from the Placer County Conservation Program In-Lieu Fee Program.
- v. Total required Project compensatory mitigation information for permanent physical loss of area for Phase Q1.1 is summarized in Table 6. [Establishment (Est.), Re-establishment (Re-est.), Rehabilitation (Reh.), Enhancement (Enh.), Preservation (Pres.), Unknown].

### b. Total Required Compensatory Mitigation for Phase Q1.2

- i. The Permittee is required to provide compensatory mitigation for the authorized impact to 1.655 acres of riverine seasonal wetland by purchasing <u>0.026 riverine/riparian complex credits and 2.457</u> <u>vernal pool complex credits from the Placer County Conservation</u> <u>Program In-Lieu Fee Program.</u>
- ii. The Permittee is required to provide compensatory mitigation for the authorized impact to 0.333 acre of seasonal wetlands by purchasing <u>0.500 vernal pool complex credits from the Placer County Conservation Program In-Lieu Fee Program.</u>
- iii. The Permittee is required to provide compensatory mitigation for the authorized impact to 0.717 acre of vernal pools by purchasing 1.076 vernal pool credits from the Placer County Conservation Program In-Lieu Fee Program.
- iv. Total required Project compensatory mitigation information for permanent physical loss of area for Phase Q1.2 is summarized in Table 7. [Establishment (Est.), Re-establishment (Re-est.), Rehabilitation (Reh.), Enhancement (Enh.), Preservation (Pres.), Unknown].
