***NOTICE OF TERMINATION OF GENERAL ORDER R5-2015-0012-024, REVISION 1,
FORMER CHROME CRAFT FACILITY, 1819 23RD STREET, SACRAMENTO,
SACRAMENTO COUNTY***

On 10 October 2018, the former Chrome Craft facility located at 1819 23rd Street in Sacramento (Site) was issued a revised Notice of Applicability (NOA) for General Order No. R5-2015-0012-024 (General Order), permitting in-situ remediation of hexavalent chromium in shallow groundwater. The revision was necessary to include new injection wells that were installed after the NOA was issued for coverage under the General Order in February of 2017. Since 2017, Chrome Craft has applied cheese whey to shallow groundwater to chemically reduce and immobilize hexavalent chromium.

Chrome Craft's remedial efforts, including in-situ remediation specifically discussed in this letter, has been successful at reducing hexavalent chromium concentrations in soil and groundwater below the Site. As further discussed in the 24 August 2022 Conditional No Further Action and No Further Action Memo, Chrome Craft has presented facts and data that support regulatory closure of the Site Cleanup case. Central Valley Water Board staff and management have previously concurred with this recommendation in writing. Accordingly, Chrome Craft has ceased in-situ remediation of groundwater and coverage under the General Order is no longer warranted.

Therefore, effective of the date signed by the Executive Officer, this Notice of Termination (NOT) is issued to Chrome Craft for Order No. R5-2015-024, Rev. 1. Upon issuance of this NOT, Chrome Craft may no longer inject, or otherwise introduce material, into groundwater below the Site.
