ORDER NO. R5-2010-0020

RESCINDING NPDES/WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region, finds that the Board adopted the following Orders which are no longer applicable for the reasons shown:

Waste Discharge Requirements Order No. 98-094, adopted 17 April 1998, prescribed requirements for Sierra Pacific Industries, Martell Division, for a wood waste landfill on its property located in the town of Martell, in Amador County. New waste discharge requirements No. R5-2009-0110 was adopted by the Board in October 2009, and supersedes all previous waste discharge requirements for this facility. Consequently, it is appropriate to rescind waste discharge requirements No. 98-094. (PG)

Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) Order 69-045 was adopted on 18 October 1968 for the Albers Milling Company for a livestock feed manufacturing plant (Plant). The WDRs regulated the discharge of boiler blowdown, cooling water, and surface runoff to an onsite storm water/percolation pond, and discharge of small quantities of neutralized laboratory chemicals to the onsite septic systems. A change in ownership was filed for the Plant in 1996 to the Manna Pro Corporation. Discharge to the onsite storm water/percolation pond ceased in 2000. In 2009, the Discharger closed the pond by backfilling it with clean compacted soil, and capped the area with an asphalt concrete pavement. In addition, the plant was connected to the City of Fresno's sewer system and the onsite septic systems were abandoned in place. With closure of the percolation pond and abandonment of the onsite septic systems, the Discharger has requested that the WDRs be rescinded. Therefore, it is appropriate to rescind the WDRs. (KC)

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above NPDES/WDR orders are rescinded.
