## ORDER NO. R5-2003-0107

## RESCINDING ORDER NO. R5-2003-0029 GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR ON-SITE STORAGE AND OFF-SITE DISPOSAL OF WASTEWATER GENERATED BY SMALL WINERIES WITHIN THE CENTRAL VALLEY REGION

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region, finds:

- 1. Some smaller commercial wineries have determined that, for the volume of waste they generate, it is more cost effective to store their wastewater in a holding tank and then transport the wastewater to an authorized disposal facility instead of complying with the regulations for the discharge of wastewater onto land.
- 2. In recognition of this disposal method, the Board adopted General Order No. R5-2003-0029, the *General Waste Discharge Requirements for the On-Site Storage and Off-Site Disposal of Wastewater Generated by Commercial Wineries Within the Central Valley Region* on 13 March 2003.
- 3. On 11 July 2003, the Regional Board adoption Resolution No. R5-2003-0106, the *Waiver for Small Food Processors, Including Wineries*. The Waiver applies to any winery or small food processor, regardless of size, that chooses to store its wastewater on-site and dispose of it off-site at a permitted treatment facility.
- 4. The Waiver includes all applicable Discharge Specifications from General Order No. R5-2003-0029. Therefore, the waiver will protect water quality to the same degree as the General Order.
- 5. With the adoption of Resolution No. R5-2003-0106, General Order No. R5-2003-0029 is no longer necessary.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Order No. R5-2003-0029 is rescinded.
