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NOTICE OF APPLICABILITY

RESOLUTION R5-2018-0085; WAIVER OF REPORT OF WASTE DISCHARGE AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR SPECIFIC TYPES OF DISCHARGE WITHIN THE CENTRAL VALLEY REGION; TEICHERT CONSTRUCTION AND WOODSIDE HOMES; ARISTA DEL SOL PHASE 1; SACRAMENTO COUNTY

On 18 May 2022, Teichert Construction submitted a Report of Waste Discharge (RWD) for coverage under the Waiver of Report of Waste Discharge and Waste Discharge Requirements for Specific Types of Discharges within the Central Valley Region, Order R5-2018-0085 (Waiver) for discharge of water from hydrostatic testing of newly installed water lines. The submittal contains all the information required to evaluate the applicability of the Waiver; therefore, the discharge qualifies for the category of hydrostatic testing and meets the conditions of the Waiver. The discharge is hereby covered under the Waiver, Resolution R5-2018-0085-0071. Please include this number on all correspondences related to this discharge. A copy of the Low Threat Waiver is enclosed and available on the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board's website.

PROJECT LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION

The Arista Del Sol Development is a planned residential community located near 4200 Grant Line Road, Rancho Cordova in Sacramento County. The Development is located on property owned by Woodside Homes. A site map is included as Attachment A. New waterlines are being constructed just south of Douglas Road and West of Grant Line Road as part of the new residential development.

Teichert Construction (Contractor) requests authorization to land discharge water generated from hydrostatic testing of the newly installed water lines. Potable water that has been chlorinated will be used to flush the newly installed water lines. The chlorinated water will be conveyed to two onsite storm water detention basins for evaporation and percolation via the storm drain system. Basins 1 and 2 have a storage capacity of approximately 4.0 and 4.7 million gallons (at 1-foot of freeboard), respectively. The detention basins are a closed system with no outfall point. Basin 1 is located at the southeast section of the property with Chrysanthy Boulevard to the south and Grant Line Road to the east. Basin 2 is located in the southwestern section of the property west of Americanos Boulevard. Approximately 560,700 gallons is estimated for intermittent discharges during the flushing activities. Flushing activities are anticipated to occur over 2 to 3 days.

Chlorinated water will be monitored for flow and sampled at multiple locations in the storm drain system and prior to discharge into the basin. Chlorine concentrations are not anticipated to exceed 10 mg/L. If chlorine concentrations exceed 10 mg/L at the outfall into the basin, chlorine bags will be placed inside the storm drain system to help dechlorinate the water.

The Project is within the jurisdiction of the Central Valley Water Quality Control Board and the operative Water Quality Control Plan is the Sacramento and San Joaquin River Basin, Fifth Edition, revised May 2018 (hereafter Basin Plan). The Basin Plan designates beneficial uses, establishes water quality objectives, contains implementation plans and policies for protecting waters of the Basin, and incorporates by reference plans and policies adopted by the State Water Resources Control Board. Pursuant to §13263(a) of the California Water Code (CWC), waste discharge requirements must implement the Basin Plan.

FACILITY-SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

Please familiarize yourself with the contents of the Waiver, including the Conditions of Discharge (Attachment A of the Waiver). The discharge must be managed in accordance with the requirements contained in the Conditions of Discharge and with the information submitted in the RWD and this Notice of Applicability (NOA). Teichert Construction and Woodside Homes are responsible for compliance with the Waiver and must provide sufficient oversight to ensure compliance and prompt reporting of any noncompliance.


