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### NOTICE OF APPLICABILITY OF WAIVER OF REPORTS OF WASTE DISCHARGE AND WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR SPECIFIC TYPES OF DISCHARGE WITHIN THE CENTRAL VALLEY REGION KUBOTA WDC PLATINUM PIPELINE, INC AND KUBOTA TRACTOR CORPORATION SACRAMENTO COUNTY

On 18 July 2023, Platinum Pipeline, Inc submitted an application for coverage under the Waiver of Report of Waste Discharge and Waste Discharge Requirements for Specific Types of Discharge within the Central Valley Region, Order R5-2018-0085 (Waiver). The submittal contains all the information required to evaluate the applicability of the Waiver; therefore, the application is considered complete, and the discharge meets the conditions of the Waiver for waste discharges from hydrostatic testing. The discharge is hereby covered under the Waiver and assigned enrollee number **Order R5-2018-0085-0084**. Please include this number on all correspondences related to this discharge. ## PROJECT LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION

The Kubota WDC is a new distribution center located at 10355 Waterman Road in Elk Grove. The facility is owned by Kubota Tractor Corporation. Platinum Pipeline, Inc (contractor) requests authorization to land discharge water generated from hydrostatic testing of newly installed domestic water and fire suppression lines. Potable water that has been chlorinated will be used to flush the domestic water lines. Unchlorinated potable water will be used to flush the fire suppression system. The flushing water will be conveyed to an onsite storm water detention basin for evaporation and percolation.

Water will remain within the basin and not allowed to discharge offsite. The basin, located in the southeast corner of the property, has a storage capacity of approximately 2.0 million gallons. Approximately 200,000 gallons of flushing water is anticipated for land discharge that will occur over 2 to 3 days during the month of September. All flushing water is expected to completely percolate and evaporate before the beginning of the rainy season.

The Project is within the jurisdiction of the Central Valley Water Quality Control Board and the operative Water Quality Control Plan is the Sacramento and San Joaquin River Basin, Fifth Edition, revised May 2018 (hereafter Basin Plan). The Basin Plan designates beneficial uses, establishes water quality objectives, contains implementation plans and policies for protecting waters of the Basin, and incorporates by reference plans and policies adopted by the State Water Resources Control Board. Pursuant to §13263(a) of the California Water Code (CWC), waste discharge requirements must implement the Basin Plan.

## FACILITY-SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

Please familiarize yourself with the contents of the Waiver, including the Conditions of Discharge (Attachment A of the Waiver). The discharge must be managed in accordance with the requirements contained in the Conditions of Discharge and with the information submitted as part of your application and this Notice of Applicability (NOA). Platinum Pipeline, Inc and Kubota Tractor Corporation (hereby collectively referred to as Discharger) are responsible for compliance with the Waiver and must provide sufficient oversight to ensure compliance and prompt reporting of any non-compliance. Upon completion of the discharge activities and confirmation that all flushing water in the basin has evaporated and/or percolated, the Discharger shall notify the Central Vally Water Board to request termination of coverage under the Waiver.
