NOTICE OF APPLICABILITY (NOA); CONDITIONAL WAIVER OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR SMALL FOOD PROCESSORS AND SMALL WINERIES WITHIN THE CENTRAL VALLEY REGION; ORDER NO. R5-2009-0097-0021; BOGLE VINEYARDS; YOLO COUNTY

Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) staff received your application including the Report of Waste Discharge (RWD) and application fee of \$1,226 submitted for Bogle Vineyards for regulatory coverage under the *Conditional Waiver* of Waste Discharge Requirements for Small Food Processors and Small Wineries within the Central Valley Region, Order No. R5-2009-0097 (Order). Bogle Vineyards is located at 37783 County Road 144, Clarksburg in Yolo County (APN 43-14-251). Based on the information in the application, we have determined that the Discharger meets the required conditions for approval under this Order for your facility and the proposed waste discharge. You are hereby assigned Order No. R5-2009-0097-0021.

The Order, adopted by the Central Valley Water Board on 8 October 2009, is a conditional waiver of waste discharge requirements for small wineries and small food processors. The Order is enclosed and may be viewed on our website at

You are urged to familiarize yourself with the contents of the entire Order which prescribes mandatory discharge and monitoring requirements. The facility must be operated in accordance with the requirements contained in the General Order, Standard Provisions and Reporting Requirements for Waste Discharge Requirements, and with the information submitted in the RWD.

DISCHARGE DESCRIPTION

Ryan Bogle (referred to as Discharger) owns and operates Bogle Vineyards. The winery will crush approximately 3,000 tons of grapes annually. The Discharger estimates an annual production of approximately 920,000 gallons of winery process wastewater. No more than 415 tons (wet weight) of residual solids (grape stems, seeds, and skins) will be produced annually based on the expected volume (3,000 tons) to be crushed each year. Wastewater from outdoor processing areas, including the uncovered crush pad, and indoor processing areas is collected in a settling sump prior to screening and storage in a 12,800 gallon

above-ground tank. Wastewater is periodically removed from the tank and hauled by truck to a municipal wastewater treatment facility (East Bay Municipal Utilities District) for treatment and disposal. No wastewater will be applied to land. Solids are screened from the process wastewater and collected into bins. These solids are applied to the adjacent vineyards by a manure spreader and disked into the soil prior to the rainy season at an approximate rate of four tons per acre per year. Approximately 104 acres of vineyards will be available to receive the solids as a soil amendment.

MONITORING AND REPORTING

This Order includes specific monitoring requirements that you must implement and reporting requirements you must comply with, including routine monitoring and reporting to the Central Valley Water Board. Please review the Monitoring and Reporting Program (MRP) closely and establish the appropriate record keeping system so that you are able to complete the required *Annual Monitoring Report* form, contained in the Order. The *Annual Monitoring Report* form must be submitted to our office by **1 February of each year**, even if there is no discharge during the reporting year.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS

This Order includes specific and general conditions required for your operation. In addition, you must maintain control over the discharge and operate in accordance to the information provided in your application.

Please review this Notice of Applicability carefully to ensure that it completely and accurately reflects the facility name, location, and discharge. Failure to comply with the requirements in the Order may result in an enforcement action as authorized by provisions of the California Water Code. If the discharge violates the terms or conditions above, the Central Valley Water Board may take enforcement action, including assessment of administrative civil liability which is a monetary penalty.

Discharge of waste material other than described in the application is prohibited. If the method of waste disposal changes from that described in your application, you must submit a new *Report of Waste Discharge Technical Information* form describing the new operation.

Please note that the Order will expire on 8 October 2014, at which time either (1) a new application with a filing fee will be necessary for regulatory coverage under a subsequently adopted new Order, or (2) the discharge must cease.
