REVISED NOTICE OF APPLICABILITY, CONDITIONAL WAIVER OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR SMALL FOOD PROCESSORS AND SMALL WINERIES WITHIN THE CENTRAL VALLEY REGION, ORDER R5-2009-0097-0060 (REVISED), SEKA HILLS OLIVE MILL, YOLO COUNTY

On 10 August 2011, the Executive Office issued a Notice of Applicability under the *Conditional Waiver of Waste Discharge Requirements for Small Food Processors and Small Wineries within the Central Valley Region*, Order R5-2009-0097 and assigned Seka Hills Olive Mill Order R5-2009-0097-0060. The Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) has received the 20 June 2012 letter providing updated information regarding the facility address and change in volume and location of the discharge. Order R5-2009-0097-0060 is being revised to reflect the changes as described in the above mentioned letter.

The Order, adopted by the Central Valley Water Board on 8 October 2009, is a conditional waiver of waste discharge requirements for small wineries and small food processors. The Order is enclosed and it is also available on the website at:

Please familiarize yourself with the contents of the Order including the discharge and monitoring requirements. The facility must be operated in accordance with the requirements contained in the Order, the information submitted in the Report of Waste Discharge (RWD), and the information included in the 20 June 2012 letter.

DISCHARGE DESCRIPTION

The Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation (referred to as Discharger) owns and operates the Seka Hills Olive Mill. The facility is located at 19326 Country Road 78, Brooks in Yolo County.

The facility will crush up to 900 tons of olives each year to make olive oil. Approximately 100,000 gallons of process wastewater will be produced annually. The Discharger anticipates wastewater flows to increase in the next five years to a maximum annual volume of 200,000 gallons, at which time the Discharger will need to apply for individual Waste Discharge Requirements.

Wastewater is generated from fruit washing, plant washdown, equipment cleaning, and boiler blowdown. The wastewater is considered to be high or low strength depending on the wastewater source and resulting constituent concentrations.

- Low strength process wastewater from olive washing and routine plant sanitation activities
 is directed into a 9,000-gallon storage tank which will be monitored for volume. This
 wastewater will be land applied. The land application area is approximately 111 acres,
 consisting of 3 acres of olive trees and 108 acres of fallow land (historically cropped with
 wheat and oats).
- High strength wastewater consisting of boiler blowdown and any boiler feed water treatment residuals is separated from low strength wastewater. This wastewater shall not be applied to land and will be disposed of at the East Bay Municipal Utility District wastewater treatment facility or equivalent facility.

Processing activities will produce approximately 218 tons of residual solids per year. The solids will be covered and contained onsite; composted to consist of a mixture of pomace, manure, and grass clippings; and land applied as a soil amendment on the 111-acre land application area.

Domestic wastewater is treated in an onsite septic system permitted through the Yolo County Health Department.

MONITORING AND REPORTING

The Order includes specific monitoring requirements for you to implement and reporting requirements you must comply with, including routine monitoring and reporting to the Central Valley Water Board. Please review the Monitoring and Reporting Program closely and establish the appropriate record keeping system so that you are able to complete the required *Annual Monitoring Report* form, contained in the Order. The *Annual Monitoring Report* form must be submitted to our office by **1 February of each year**, even if there is no discharge during the reporting year.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND REQUIREMENTS

The Order includes specific and general conditions required for your operation. In addition, you must maintain control over the discharge and operate in accordance with the information provided in your application and this Notice of Applicability (NOA).

Please review this NOA carefully to ensure that it completely and accurately reflects the facility name, location, and discharge. Failure to comply with the requirements of the Order may result in enforcement action as authorized by provisions of the California Water Code, which could include civil liability.

Discharge of waste material not described in the RWD is prohibited. If the method of waste disposal changes from that described in your application, you must submit an updated RWD to describe the new operation. Process wastewater and residual solids placed or stored in any surface impoundment, pond or lagoon is prohibited under this waiver.

Please note that the Order will expire on 8 October 2014, at which time you must do one of the following:

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- 1. Submit a new application with a filing fee to obtain coverage under a subsequently adopted waiver, or
- 2. Submit an application with a filing fee to apply for an individual or general Waste Discharge Requirements, or
- 3. Cease the discharge.

Coverage under this Order applies to small food processors and small wineries whose discharge to land does not exceed 100,000 gallons of wastewater per year. Staff understands that the Discharger anticipates increased flows to a maximum amount of 200,000 gallons within five years. In addition, future development of the olive oil processing facility will include a treatment pond to dispose of wastewater from the Olive Mill operations. At that time, the Discharger will need to apply for coverage under individual Waste Discharge Requirements.

Application for coverage under this Order requires coverage under the State Water Resources Control Board Order 97-03-DWQ (General NPDES Permit No. CAS000001), titled *Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Storm Water Associated with Industrial Activities*. Central Valley Water Board staff has received the 15 June 2011 Notice of Non-Applicability (NONA) submitted by the Discharger. However, because the construction of the facility is not complete, the NONA has not been approved.
