SUBJECT: Rescinding various NPDES Permits

REPORT: Following is a proposed order rescinding 2 sets of NPDES Permits

- a. Order No. 5-01-136 (NPDES Permit No. 0084743) adopted 14 June 2001 prescribes waste discharge requirements for the United States Department of Army (Discharger) Titan 1-A Missile Facility Groundwater Treatment Plant. The Groundwater Treatment Plant is located near the City of Lincoln and discharges treated groundwater to an unnamed surface water drainage flowing into Ingram Slough, a tributary to Auburn Ravine. Although the groundwater cleanup is not complete, the Discharger has ceased discharging treated groundwater to surface waters. For this reason, the NPDES permit is no longer needed.
- b. Waste Discharge Requirements Order No. R5-2002-0110 (NPDES No. CA 0083763) adopted 7 June 2002, prescribes requirements for the discharge of treated wastewater from the Altamont Landfill & Resource Recovery Wastewater Treatment Facility. The Order permitted surface water discharge during the winter months to an unnamed ephemeral stream tributary to Mountain House Creek, waters of the United States. The Order expired on 1 June 2007 and a complete application for renewal of the permit was not submitted to the Regional Water Board. On 21 May 2007, the Discharger requested that the Order be rescinded, because the surface water discharge is no longer necessary. (ARM)

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above NPDES Permits are rescinded.
