One thing I am very interested in revolves around a letter dated December 10, 1941 from C.F. Kelley to Mr. J.R. Walker (File 16406.02). I would like to know if there is an original copy of this letter that shows the letterhead on which the letter was written. If so, we would like a copy.

2nd. In the December 10th letter, Mr. Kelley indicates that he is answering Mr. Walker's "letter of November 6th, with which you enclosed a letter dated the previous day, addressed to the Walker Mining Company at Salt Lake City". We have a copy of Mr. Walker's letter dated the previous day (November 5th, File 00303.01), but do not have a copy of the referenced November 6th letter. If you have this letter in your files, we would like a copy.
