NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

**AMENDMENT OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS
(NPDES PERMIT CA0078956)**

For
**CITY OF PLACERVILLE
HANGTOWN CREEK WATER RECLAMATION FACILITY
EL DORADO COUNTY**

The City of Placerville is the owner and operator of the Hangtown Creek Water Reclamation Facility (Facility) a publicly owned treatment works located at 2300 Coolwater Creek Road, Placerville, California. The Facility provides sewerage service for the City of Placerville and a portion of El Dorado County and serves a population of approximately 10,000. Treated wastewater from the Facility is discharged to Hangtown Creek, which flows to Weber Creek, and is ultimately discharged to the South Fork of the American River, a water of the United States.

Discharges from the Facility are currently regulated by Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR) Order R5-2014-0015, issued by the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) on 7 February 2014. Monitoring locations UVS-001 and EFF-001, as described in WDR Order R5-2014-0015, are the same location, therefore, the existing total coliform organism monitoring requirements of Table E-7 are duplicative of the total coliform monitoring requirements of Table E-3. The proposed amendments to WDR Order R5-2014-0015 appropriately require monitoring of the Facility's Ultraviolet Light system (UVS) and compliance monitoring for total coliform organism effluent limits at EFF-001 only.

Only designated parties will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to introduce exhibits; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. All other persons wishing to testify or provide comments are interested persons and not designated parties. Such interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m. on 26 May 2014**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is directly affected by the discharge.

Persons wishing to comment on this noticed hearing item shall submit testimony, evidence, if any, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m.** on **26 May 2014**. Written evidence or comments submitted after **5:00 p.m.** on **26 May 2014** will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record if doing so would prejudice any party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting, and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair.
