SUBJECT:	Recology Hay Road, Jepson Prairie Organics as a DBA of Recology Hay Road, Recology Hay Road Landfill, Solano County	
BOARD ACTION:	<i>Consideration to Amend 13301 Order (Order) R5-2014-0057</i>	
FACILITY BACKGROUND:	<p>The Board issued a 13301 Order to Recology at its October 2014 meeting to address violations of WDRs Order R5-2008-0188, particularly with respect to lack of waste separation from groundwater, drainage controls, compost operations, and leachate management. The adopted 13301 Order provided the Discharger with a schedule to either make improvements to come back into compliance with the WDRs, or to seek revised WDRs allowing its current practices to continue while in the interim allowing the Discharger to continue operating the landfill in an environmentally acceptable manner.</p> <p>On 20 January 2015, Recology Hay Road submitted a RWD requesting that the WDRs be revised to reflect the practices and operations described in (a)-(c), below.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) the configuration of the compost ponds; (b) the use of an aerated static pile composting method of composting (instead of in-vessel composting); and (c) no longer using compost leachate for dust control. <p>It was envisioned that the Discharger would have met all compliance dates in the 13301 Order, and revised WDRs would be prepared for the Board's consideration by February 2016. However, the new WDRs are not yet ready for Board consideration, and as a result Recology will be out of compliance with the 13301 Order unless the time schedule is amended. Therefore, an amendment to the 13301 Order has been prepared. The Amended 13301 Order will extend timelines so that Recology remains in compliance with the 13301 Order until new WDRs are considered at either the April or June 2016 Board meeting. It memorializes past work and establishes new dates and requirements to achieve groundwater separation. Granting the requested extension will merely preserve the status quo with regard to the compost pond configuration, the use of aerated static piles, and no longer using compost leachate as dust control until the revised WDRs are adopted.</p>	
RECOMMENDATION:	Staff recommends adoption of Amended 13301 Order.
