(NPDES NO. CA0081809)**

SIERRA COUNTY**

Original Sixteen to One Mine, Inc. (Discharger) owns and operates Sixteen to One Mine. Untreated mining wastewater is discharged from the Mine to Kanaka Creek, a tributary of the Middle Yuba River.

The Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) will consider amending the Discharger's existing Time Schedule Order R5-2015-0035, to include typographical error corrections and amended interim effluent limitations that reflect new data collected by the Discharger between April 2015 and December 2017. The proposed amended order will contain the identical compliance schedule and continue to extend protection from mandatory minimum penalties to the Discharger for effluent violations of EC, antimony, arsenic, cadmium, copper, iron, lead, manganese, and nickel until 16 April 2020.

Only designated parties will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to introduce exhibits; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. All other persons wishing to testify or provide comments are interested persons and not designated parties. Such interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m. on 23 February 2018**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is directly affected by the discharge.

Persons wishing to comment on this noticed hearing item shall submit testimony, evidence, if any, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Water Board via email to **RB5S-NPDES-Comments@waterboards.ca.gov**, attention Joshua Palmer, no later than **5:00 p.m. on 23 February 2018**. Written evidence or comments submitted after **5:00 p.m. on 23 February 2018** will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record absent a ruling by the Board Chair. Any party requesting to submit late materials must demonstrate good cause for the late

submission, and the Chair must find that accepting the late submission will not prejudice the Central Valley Water Board or any Designated Party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting, and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair.
