**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**

concerning

**RENEWAL OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS  
NPDES PERMIT NO. CA0079651  
AND RESCISSION OF TIME SCHEDULE ORDER R5-2011-0056-01  
FOR  
LINDA COUNTY WATER DISTRICT  
WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT  
YUBA AND SUTTER COUNTIES**

The Linda County Water District is the owner and operator of the Linda County Water District, Wastewater Treatment Plant (hereinafter Facility), a publicly owned treatment works (POTW) located at 909 Myrna Avenue, Marysville, California. The Facility provides sewerage services for the community of Linda and portions of unincorporated Yuba County, serving a population of approximately 12,000. The Facility provides tertiary treatment for up to 5.0 million gallons per day (MGD), with plans to expand the capacity to 6.7 MGD to accommodate a regionalization project with the City of Marysville. Tertiary treated wastewater from the Facility is discharged to the Feather River, a water of the United States, via seven percolation ponds that lie within the Feather River floodplain. The Facility may also discharge directly to the Feather River.

Discharges from the Facility are currently regulated by Waste Discharge Requirements Order R5-2012-0034, issued by the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) on 7 June 2012, and Time Schedule Order R5-2011-0056-01, amended by the Central Valley Water Board on 7 June 2012. An Order is proposed to renew the NPDES permit and rescind the Time Schedule Order. The proposed permit includes new or updated effluent limitations for ammonia, chlorodibromomethane, diazinon, chlorpyrifos, dichlorobromomethane, mercury, and nitrate plus nitrite. The permit removes effluent limitations for carbon tetrachloride, copper, electrical conductivity, manganese, methylene blue active substances, and nitrite because the discharge does not demonstrate reasonable potential to cause or contribute to instream exceedances of the applicable water quality objectives for these constituents.

Only designated parties will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to introduce exhibits; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. All other persons wishing to testify or provide comments are interested persons and not designated parties. Such interested persons may request status as

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a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m. on 5 June 2017**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is directly affected by the discharge.

Persons wishing to comment on this noticed hearing item shall submit testimony, evidence, if any, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Water Board, or via email to **RB5S-NPDES-Comments@waterboards.ca.gov** no later than **5:00 p.m. on 5 June 2017**. Written evidence or comments submitted after **5:00 p.m. on 5 June 2017** will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record absent a ruling by the Board Chair. Any party requesting to submit late materials must demonstrate good cause for the late submission, and the Board Chair must find that accepting the late submission will not prejudice the Central Valley Water Board or any Designated Party. All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting, and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair.
