Re: Support for the Renewal of the Low Threat Waiver of WDR's, RWD's, and/or WRR's in the

Central Valley Region

Dear Members and Senior Staff of the Central Valley Water Board,

We are the owners/operators of a food processing by-product reuse land application site permit in Stanislaus County. We have been managing/operating the permitted site for over 30 years as a soil amendment program. The site is heavily monitored and inspected on a weekly basis during the season by Senior Stanislaus County Staff, with a comprehensive report compiled and due annually. The report covers such items as by-product type, number of truckloads delivered, moisture content, and third-party State of California licensed lab analysis. With over 30 years of operational and management experience, the site has never received a formal complaint or violation from Stanislaus County.

The service we provide provides a tremendous cost effective and environmentally friendly alternative to dumping the food processing by-product in the Stanislaus County landfill. The management and incorporation of the natural food by-product into the farming soils provides organic matter that benefits the soil structure and food production. The by-product is spread over hundreds of acres annually and is dried by sunlight and then incorporated into the soil. Our site and the Stanislaus County Food Processing By-Product Reuse Program should be used as a model throughout the State of California.

We strongly urge the California State Water Resources Control Board to renew the Low Threat Waiver for this type of program.
