## RESCINDING WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region (Central Valley Water Board), finds that the Central Valley Water Board adopted the following Orders which are no longer applicable for the reasons shown:

## a. CRIMSON RESOURCE MANAGEMENT, STANDARD LEASE, ASPHALTO OIL FIELD, KERN COUNTY, WDR ORDER NO. R5-2004-0058

Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) order R5-2004-0058, adopted on 23 April 2004, prescribes requirements for the discharges of oil field produced wastewater to ponds at Crimson Resource Management Corporation's (Crimson) Asphalto Standard (or Standard) Lease in the Asphalto Oil Field (Facility). The Facility is a crude oil production facility where ponds are used for oil field produced wastewater disposal.

WDRs Order No. R5-2004-0058 are outdated and do not reflect current plans and policies of the Central Valley Water Board. On 24 February 2024, Crimson received a Notice of Applicability (NOA) for Waste Discharge Requirements for Oil Field Discharges to Land, General Order Three, Order Number R5-2017-0036. Therefore, it is appropriate to rescind WDRs Order No. R5-2004-0058.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above Orders are rescinded on the date of this order unless otherwise stated above.
