WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS ORDER R5 2020-####
CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION
STATE ROUTE 120/MCKINLEY AVENUE INTERCHANGE PROJECT
SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY

A tentative Waste Discharge Requirements Order (Order) is proposed for the California Department of Transportation (Permittee), State Route 120/McKinley Avenue Interchange Project (Project) in San Joaquin County. The 109-acre Project will construct a new interchange on SR-120 at McKinley Avenue and provide improvements to McKinley Avenue and SR-120. The interchange will be a spread diamond interchange that includes westbound and eastbound on- and off-ramps. Improvements include developing seven lanes under SR-120, and addition of turning lanes, and a bike lane/pedestrian walkway.

The tentative Order provides details of the proposed Project activities, including compensatory mitigation measures planned to compensate for the permanent loss of waters of the state and requiring avoidance and minimization measures to reduce on-site impacts during construction activities. The tentative Order describes technical conditions required to be met throughout the implementation of construction activities that allow for activities to meet Basin Plan objectives.

A public hearing concerning this matter will be held during the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) meeting scheduled for:

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The designated parties for this hearing are as follows:

Only designated parties will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to introduce exhibits; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. Interested persons may not cross examine witnesses and will not be subject to cross examination. Interested persons may submit evidence (e.g., photographs, eye-witness testimony, monitoring data) if the evidence is submitted in accordance with the deadlines for submitting evidence described below. Interested persons who present evidence may be subject to cross-examination. Interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Board no later than **5 p.m on 11 January 2021**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is affected by the discharge.

Persons wishing to comment on this item must submit testimony, evidence, if any, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Water Board via email to Nicholas.White@Waterboards.ca.gov no later than by **5:00 p.m. on 11 January 2021**. Written materials submitted after 5:00 p.m. on the above date will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record absent a ruling by the Board Chair. Any party requesting to submit late materials must demonstrate good cause for the late submission, and the Chair must find that the late submission would not prejudice the Central Valley Water Board or any designated party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair.
