TENTATIVE RESCISSION OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS ORDER NO. 86-230, MIKE AND MONICA SCHWENNE, GOLDEN HILLS MOBILE HOME PARK, MARIPOSA COUNTY

TO ALL CONCERNED PERSONS AND AGENCIES:

Enclosed is a tentative order rescinding Waste Discharge Requirements for Mike and Monica Schwenne, Golden Hills Mobile Home Park (Facility) in Mariposa County. A Public Hearing has been scheduled for the Central Valley Water Board to consider adoption of the tentative Orders at its **31 May - 1 June 2018** Board Meeting. For the tentative rescission order to be included with the adopted orders, you must post the enclosed Notice of Public Hearing by **21 February 2018** at the following locations:

- The entrance to the facility;
- The nearest city hall or county courthouse; and
- The post office nearest to the Facility (if allowed).

To verify the Notice of Public Hearing has been posted, a completed copy of the enclosed Proof of Posting form must be sent to our office by **28 February 2018**.


Any comments or recommendations you or others may have concerning the tentative Order must be submitted in writing to the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) office by **5 p.m. on 23 March 2018**. Written materials submitted after this date and time will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record if doing so would prejudice to any party. Please note that the tentative documents will receive internal legal and management review during the public comment period.

The Golden Hills Mobile Home Park (Facility), owned by Mike and Monica Schwenne (Discharger), is located at 10265 Piney Creek Road, Coulterville in Mariposa County. The Facility discharges wastewater in accordance with Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) Order 86-230, adopted by the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) on 12 December 1986.

The Facility is operated by Sierra Clean Water Services and treats domestic wastewater from a small community of 12 occupied mobile homes. Typical daily throughput in the treatment system is approximately 900 to 1,200 gallons per day (gpd) in dry weather and 1,300 to 1,600 gpd during periods of rain. The Facility is a small package plant consisting of an aeration tank and clarifier with an average design capacity of 2,000 gpd equipped with four ponds that are built in series.

Central Valley Water Board staff determined that the Facility can be regulated under State Water Resources Control Board General Order 2014-0153-DWQ *for General Waste Discharge Requirements for Small Domestic Wastewater Treatment Systems*. The Notice of Applicability was issued to the Discharger on 14 February 2018, assigning General Order and Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 2014-0153-DWQ-R5245 to the Facility.

The Central Valley Water Board will consider rescinding Waste Discharge Requirements Order 86-230. A public hearing to address this matter will be held during the Central Valley Water Board meeting which is scheduled for:

The designated parties for this hearing are as follows:

Designated parties but not interested persons will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. Central Valley Water Board staff will prepare the administrative record, and may present evidence, make an oral presentation and cross-examine opposing witnesses.

Interested persons may not cross examine witnesses, and will not be subject to cross examination. Interested persons may submit evidence (e.g., photographs, eye-witness testimony, monitoring data) if the evidence is submitted in accordance with the deadlines for submitting evidence described below. Interested persons who present evidence may be subject to cross-examination. Interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5 p.m. on 23 March 2018**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is affected by the discharge.

The notification for the Planned Rescission of Waste Discharge Requirements was issued on **14 February 2018**. Persons wishing to comment on this item must submit testimony, evidence, if any, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5 p.m. on 23 March 2018**. Written materials submitted after this date and time will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record if doing so would prejudice any party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting, and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair. Both designated parties and interested persons may be asked to respond to clarifying questions from Board members, counsel staff or others, at the discretion of the Board.



RESCINDING WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region, finds that the Board adopted the following Order, which is no longer applicable for the reasons shown:

Waste Discharge Requirements Order 86-230, adopted on 12 December 1986, prescribes requirements for the discharge of wastewater from the Golden Hills Mobile Home Park (Facility) located at 10265 Piney Creek Road, Coulterville in Mariposa County. The Facility is operated by Sierra Clean Water Services and owned by Mike and Monica Schwenne. The Facility treats domestic wastewater from a small community of 12 occupied mobile homes. Typical daily throughput in the treatment system is approximately 900 to 1,200 gpd in dry weather and 1,300 to 1,600 gpd during periods of rain. The Facility is a small package plant consisting of an aeration tank and clarifier with an average design capacity of 2,000 gpd equipped with four ponds that are built in series. Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board staff determined that the Facility can be regulated under State Water Resources Control Board General Order 2014-0153-DWQ *for General Waste Discharge Requirements for Small Domestic Wastewater Treatment Systems*. The Notice of Applicability was issued to the Discharger on 14 February 2018, assigning General Order and Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 2014-0153-DWQ-R5245 to the Facility. Therefore, it is appropriate to rescind Waste Discharge Requirements Order 86-230.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above waste discharge requirements Order are rescinded.
