TENTATIVE ORDER R5-2020-XXXX

RESCINDING WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS ORDER 90-226

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region (Central Valley Water Board), finds that the Central Valley Water Board adopted the following Order which is no longer applicable for the reasons shown:

- a) Waste Discharge Requirements Order 90-226, adopted on 10 August 1990, prescribes requirements for wastewater discharge from Kimura Farms, Inc.'s prune drying facility (Facility) located in Butte County. Wastewater at the Facility is generated during the fruit rinsing process and is discharged to an adjacent orchard. On 20 November 2020 the Facility was issued a Notice of Applicability for coverage under the *Conditional Waiver of Waste Discharge Requirements for Small Food Processors, Wineries, and Related Agricultural Processors within the Central Valley Region*, Resolution R5-2020-0002. Therefore, it is appropriate to rescind WDRs Order 90-226.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above Waste Discharge Requirements Order 90-226 is rescinded.
