NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

MUNICIPAL SEPARATE STORM SEWER SYSTEMS

County of Lake, City of Clearlake, and City of Lakeport (collectively, Permittees) own and operate their own respective municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4) located within the urban areas of their jurisdictions. Storm water discharges from the Permittees' MS4s are currently regulated by National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) General Permit for Waste Discharge Requirements for Storm Water Discharges from Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems, Order No. 2013-0001-DWQ (Small MS4 General Permit), as amended. Due to several wildfires and flooding events over the last few years, staff turnover, and the absence of financial stability for their MS4 Programs, the Permittees have been unable to implement appropriate monitoring efforts to evaluate the current storm water program and infrastructure to determine if their wasteload allocation (WLA) established under the total maximum daily load for nutrients in Clear Lake has been met. The Permittees have requested time to complete a best management practices (BMP) effectiveness study to determine if they are meeting their WLA. Depending on the outcome of their BMP study, the Permittees may require additional time to implement a Phosphorus Reduction Work Plan to comply with their WLA beyond the BMP study.

Persons wishing to comment on this proposed Time Schedule Order shall submit testimony, evidence, if any, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board), or via email to RB5S-NPDES-Comments@Waterboards.ca.gov no later than **5:00 p.m.** on **25 November 2019**. Written materials or comments, including emails, submitted after **5:00 p.m.** on **25 November 2019** will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record absent a ruling by the Chair. Any party requesting to submit late materials must demonstrate good cause for the late submission, and the Chair must find that accepting the late submission will not prejudice the Central Valley Water Board or any Designated Party.

Any member of the public may request an oral hearing before the Executive Officer. If no oral hearing is requested, the public comment period, and the Executive Officer's review of the administrative record, including any written comments, shall constitute the public hearing. (See Water Code section 13385, subdivision (j)(3)(C)(ii)(II).) Based on comments received, the

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Executive Officer may decide to hold an oral hearing, or the matter will be considered at the Central Valley Water Board meeting scheduled for:

If this matter is considered at a public hearing, the designated parties are as follows:

- County of Lake representatives
- City of Clearlake representatives
- City of Lakeport representatives

Only designated parties will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to introduce exhibits; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. All other persons wishing to testify or provide comments are interested persons and not designated parties. Such interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 p.m. on 25 November 2019**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is directly affected by the discharge.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair or Executive Officer.
