ORDER **R5-2018-XXXX**

RESCINDING WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS ORDER R5-2011-0090 AND
CEASE AND DESIST ORDER R5-2004-0101

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region (hereinafter Central Valley Water Board), finds that Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) Order R5-2011-0090 and Cease and Desist Order (CDO) R5-2004-0101 are no longer applicable for the reasons below:

- Sierra Pacific Industries (Discharger), Anderson Division sawmill (Facility) is currently regulated pursuant to Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) Order R5-2011-0090 and Cease and Desist Order (CDO) R5-2004-0101. The Discharger has completed Facility modifications to eliminate discharge to the Sacramento River. Specifically, the Discharger has modified its onsite wastewater management in an effort to eliminate the need to discharge industrial storm water to the river for up to 100-year annual precipitation. Pump stations and piping were added, and drainage was modified to enable the industrial storm water from the southern portion of the Facility to be directed into storage ponds rather than discharged to the Sacramento River. Because discharge to surface water has been eliminated, and WDRs Order R5-2018-0029 was adopted by the Central Valley Water board on 6 April 2018 to permit the Facility's waste discharge to land, it is appropriate to rescind WDRs Order R5-2011-0090 and CDO R5-2004-0101.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that WDRs Order R5-2011-0090 and CDO R5-2004-0101 are rescinded.
