### PREPARATION OF NOTICE OF APPLICABILITY

#### Waste Discharge Requirements General Order for In-Situ Groundwater Remediation and Discharge of Treated Groundwater to Land

#### TO ALL INTERESTED AGENCIES, GROUPS AND PERSONS

The Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) has prepared a draft Notice of Applicability for the unauthorized underground storage tank (UST) release at the Stallworth Auto Sales (Site) for coverage under General Order No. R5-2015-0012, *Waste Discharge Requirements General Order for In-situ Groundwater Remediation and Discharge of Treated Groundwater to Land (General Order)*. Coverage under the General Order will allow the property owner to add specific compounds to groundwater to break down remaining fuel compounds including benzene and methyl tert butyl ether (MTBE) hydrocarbons from the former gasoline station that operated on the property.

**Project Title:** Stallworth Auto Sales

**Project Location:** 602 North California Street, Stockton, San Joaquin County

**Public Comment Period:** 26 March 2018 to 26 April 2018

#### Project Description:

The property at 602 North California Street, Stockton is occupied with a small, single story office facility with a garage utilized for auto sales. In 1991, a release of gasoline and diesel was discovered during underground storage tank (UST) removal activities, and investigation and cleanup began. Samples collected from beneath the former USTs indicated that gasoline and diesel had been released into both soil and groundwater. To date cleanup efforts have removed or destroyed more than 10,201 pounds of petroleum hydrocarbons from soil and groundwater at the Site. Proposed groundwater cleanup will include injecting hydrogen peroxide into the groundwater to stimulate biological breakdown of the remaining fuel compounds.
