VULCAN MATERIALS COMPANY
GRANT LINE CONSTRUCTION AGGREGATE PRODUCTION AND RECYCLING
FACILITY PROJECT
SACRAMENTO COUNTY

A tentative Waste Discharge Requirements Order (Order) is proposed for Vulcan Materials Company (Permittee), Grant Line Construction Aggregate Production and Recycling Facility Project (Project) in Sacramento County. The 25-acre Project will develop a concrete and asphalt recycling and production facility in Elk Grove. The facility will be capable of processing 1.7 million tons of construction aggregate materials annually, including hot-mix asphalt and ready-mix concrete. Approximately 600,000 tons of raw aggregate will be imported to the facility from Vulcan's aggregate mine, located approximately 11 miles northeast of the site at 15012 Florin Road in Sacramento. The facility will also recycle asphalt and concrete from local demolition projects. The project will construct a ready-mix concrete production facility, a concrete and asphalt recycling facility, a hot-mix asphalt facility, and associated facilities including modular office buildings. There are several seasonal wetlands located on the project site that will be permanently impacted from grading the site. All stormwater from the site will be captured, stored, and infiltrated to maintain pre-Project runoff quantities. Runoff from the aggregate processing and recycling facility will be directed to a sediment basin located near the southwestern portion of the Project site. After suspended sediment settles, runoff will be further treated in a bioretention pond, north of the sediment basin, before being released to a dry well to allow for percolation of the treated water. A second bioretention basin will be located near the entrance gate at Waterman Road and used to treat runoff from the entry area before it is released into the City's storm drain system.

The tentative Order provides details of the proposed Project activities, including compensatory mitigation measures planned to compensate for the permanent loss of waters of the state and requiring avoidance and minimization measures to reduce onsite impacts during construction activities. The tentative Order describes technical conditions required to be met throughout the implementation of construction activities that allow for activities to meet Basin Plan objectives.

Only designated parties will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to introduce exhibits; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. Interested persons may not cross examine witnesses and will not be subject to cross examination. Interested persons may submit evidence (e.g., photographs, eye-witness testimony, monitoring data) if the evidence is submitted in accordance with the deadlines for submitting evidence described below. Interested persons who present evidence may be subject to cross-examination. Interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Board no later than 5 p.m on 18 March 2024. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is affected by the discharge.

Written materials submitted after 5:00 p.m. on the above date will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record absent a ruling by the Board Chair. Any party requesting to submit late materials must demonstrate good cause for the late submission, and the Chair must find that the late submission would not prejudice the Central Valley Water Board or any designated party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair.
