PUBLIC NOTICE: PROPOSED PETROLEUM UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CASE CLOSURE

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: 25 September through 25 November 2025

**QUICK-N-SAVE; 1901 SOUTH EL DORADO STREET, STOCKTON,
SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY; GLOBAL ID #T0607700903**

The Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Valley Water Board) invites public comment on the proposed case closure of the Quick-N-Save #1 leaking underground storage tank (tank) case, located at 1901 South El Dorado Street in Stockton, CA (property). A map showing the location is attached as Figure 1.

In October 1999, the property owner removed four underground storage tanks (tanks) from the property. Soil samples collected beneath the tanks contained petroleum, indicating an unauthorized release of petroleum had occurred at the property. The property owner conducted additional investigations in August 2003 to assess the extent of petroleum contamination in soil and to determine if the release had contaminated groundwater. Between March 2005 and January 2024, multiple investigations were performed to assess the extent of petroleum contamination in soil and groundwater. Residents in the area of the groundwater contamination (Figure 1) receive municipal water and do not use domestic groundwater wells.

The property owner's consultant working on this project has concluded that petroleum remaining in the ground does not pose a significant threat to human health, the environment, or future property activities. The remaining petroleum in soil and groundwater will naturally break down within a reasonable amount of time. The consultant recommended case closure under California's Low-Threat Closure Policy. Central Valley Water Board staff will consider public comments during case closure review.

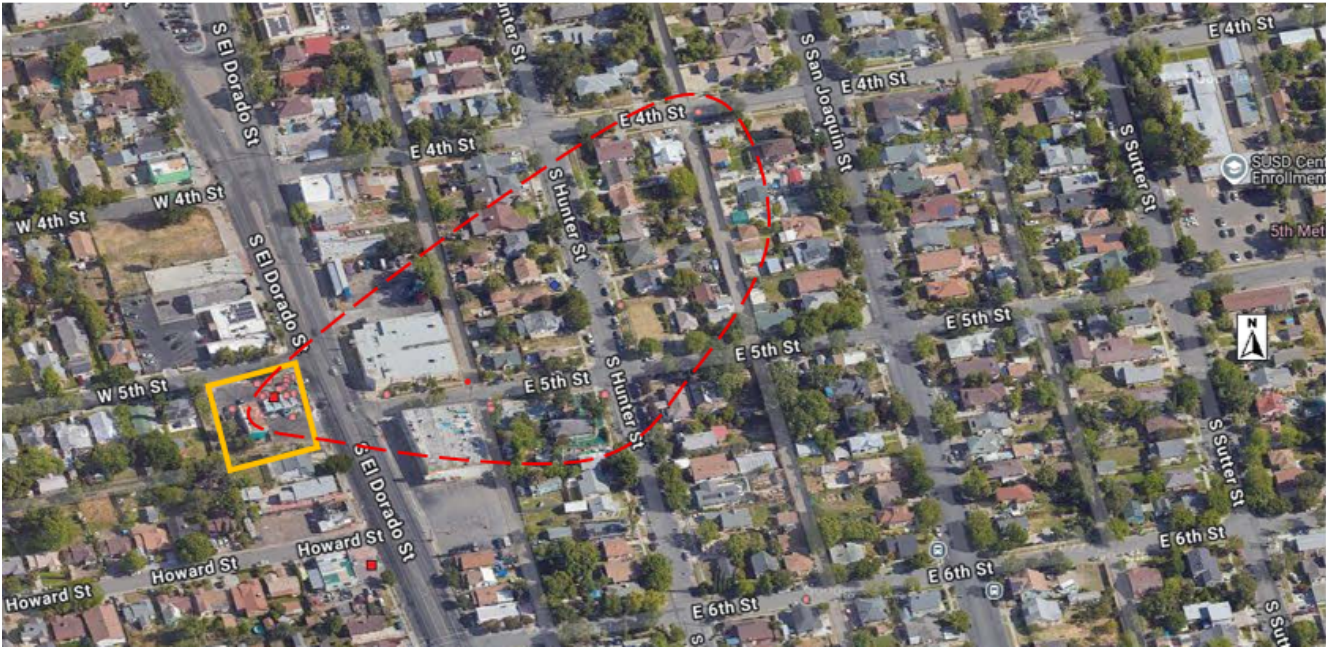
