**REVISED NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT,
PUBLIC HEARING, AND FILING¹**

Concerning

**An Amendment to the Water Quality Control Plan for the Sacramento
River and San Joaquin River Basins for the Control of Pyrethroid
Pesticide Discharges**

**The hearing previously scheduled for 5/6 December 2016 has been changed to
23/24 February 2017. See below notice for further details.**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the Central Valley Water Board will accept comments regarding the development of an amendment (the “Proposed Amendment”) to the Water Quality Control Plan for the Sacramento River and San Joaquin River Basins (Basin Plan). The Proposed Amendment would establish controls for the discharges of pyrethroid pesticides into selected surface waters in the Sacramento and San Joaquin River Basin, and a program of implementation, including:

- A conditional prohibition of discharges of pyrethroid pesticides above certain concentrations into surface waters with aquatic life beneficial uses
- Total Maximum Daily Loads for pyrethroid pesticides in selected surface waters
- Recommendations for agencies that regulate the use of pesticides
- Proposed Board actions for the control of pesticide discharges
- Monitoring requirements and other provisions to ensure data and information is produced to assess progress and inform future Board actions
- Policies and monitoring requirements that address alternative pesticides to pyrethroids

The Board’s Basin Planning Program is considered a certified regulatory program, which means that the Board is exempt from the requirement to prepare an environmental impact report for basin planning activities under the California Environmental Quality Act. (Pub. Res. Code, § 21080.5; Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 15251(g).) The Board’s environmental review of the proposed Basin Plan Amendment is instead contained in a draft Staff Report, which is considered to be part of the “substitute environmental documentation” or “SED”, and which will be posted on the Board’s website (below) along with the Proposed Amendment no later than **12 January 2017**:

The Board is inviting the public and other agencies to submit written comments on the Proposed Amendment and draft SED from **12 January 2017** through **27 February 2017**. Written comments must be submitted to the above email or postal address by **27 February 2017** in order for them to be included in the administrative record.

At the February hearing, Board staff will provide the Board with initial recommendations regarding the Proposed Amendment and draft SED. The Board will provide members of the public, stakeholders, and representatives of other agencies the opportunity to present oral comments on the Proposed Amendment and the adequacy of the SED. Though the Board may provide direction to Board staff, the Board will not take action on the Proposed Amendment at the December hearing.

Oral presentations may be limited to 3-minutes at the discretion of the Board Chair. Groups are encouraged to designate a spokesperson. All exhibits presented at the hearings, including charts, graphs, and other testimony, must be left with the Board and will become part of the administrative record. At the discretion of the Board Chair, panels of interested parties may also present to the Board on pyrethroids in surface water and the control program under development for the potential Basin Plan Amendment. Persons or groups interested in presenting to the Board as part of a panel should contact Tessa Fojut or Danny McClure by 1 February 2017.
