My name is Lolita Adrien and I am a concerned citizen of Lake County. I am a stakeholder because I live on the shoreline of Clear Lake. Of my approximately 350 feet of shoreline, about one-third is what I call "The Habitat", which has been left natural with tules and willows. Except for two small boat ramps, the remainder of the shoreline is alive with tules. I am serious about doing my part to curb nutrient loading.

The parties responsible for the Clear Lake Nutrient TMDL should NOT be given another 10 to 20 years in order to meet compliance. They already have had 10 years of, basically, doing little to nothing to meet compliance. This issue is too important to the health of Clear Lake and to the quality of life of we who live in Lake County.

I firmly believe that residents of Lake County do not want to wait another generation for standards and enforcement. We want the agencies that are stewards for water quality in Lake County and California to be able to do their jobs, be effective and include meaningful public collaboration in protecting this valuable and important resource called Clear Lake.
