ORDER NO. 76-12

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE TWIN PINES RANCH SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL SITE Southeast of Banning - Riverside County

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region finds that:

- 1. The County of Riverside Probation Department (hereinafter also referred to as the discharger), P.O. Box 833, Riverside CA 92502, submitted a Report of Waste Discharge dated October 27, 1975.
 - 2. Solid Wastes from facilities serving about 80 persons are disposed to a 0.25 acre solid waste disposal site located in the NE¼ of the NE¼ of Section 32, T3S, R2E, SBB&M. The solid waste consists primarily of paper and empty food containers Food wastes are ground in a garbage disposal and discharged into the ranch septic tank-leach field system. The site is operated as a trench landfill, the refuse being covered weekly.
 - 3. The disposal area is on the top of a small knoll formed by a bend in Ditch Creek, a small, intermittent creek draining approximately 2 square miles of the northwest slope of the San Jacinto Mountains. The lowest part of the disposal area is an estimated 10 feet above the stream bed.
 - 4. This disposal site meets the criteria contained in the California Administrative Code, Title 23, Chapter 3, subchapter 15, for classification as a Class II-2 Disposal Site suitable to receive Group 2 and Group 3 wastes.
 - 5. The beneficial uses of the groundwaters in the San Gorgonio Hydrologic Unit are municipal, industrial, and agricultural water supply.

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- 6. The beneficial uses of waters in small streams in the San Gorgonio Hydrologic Unit, including Ditch Creek are:
 - a. Groundwater recharge
 - b. Non-contact recreation
 - c. Wildlife habitat
- 7. Land within 1000 feet of this site is used as pasture for cattle.
- 8. The County of Riverside is preparing a solid waste management master plan.
- 9. The Water Quality Control Plan for the West Colorado River Basin was adopted by the Board on April 10, 1975. This Order implements the objectives stated in the plan.
- 10. The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to prescribe waste discharge requirements for this discharge.
- 11. The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharge.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the County of Riverside Probation Department shall comply with the following:

A. Discharge Specifications

- 1. The treatment or disposal of wastes shall not cause pollution or a nuisance.
- 2. Waste materials shall not be discharged or allowed to be wind blown outside the designated disposal site shown on the attached site map.
- 3. The disposal area shall be protected from any washout or erosion of wastes or covering material, and from inundation, which would occur as a result of floods having a predicted frequency of once in a 100 year period.
- 4. Surface drainage from tributary areas, and internal site drainage from surface or subsurface sources shall not contact or percolate through waste other than Group 3 wastes discharged at this site.

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- 5. Group 1 wastes shall not be discharged at this site.
- 6. Group 2 wastes shall not be discharged on any surface which is less than 10 feet above the highest anticipated ground-water level.
- 7. The discharger shall remove and relocate any wastes which are discharged at this site in violation of these requirements.

B. Provisions

- 1. The discharger shall construct flood protection facilities to comply with Discharge Specifications No. 3 and 4 by not later than May 1, 1976.
- 2. The discharger shall comply with the "Monitoring and Reporting Program No. 76-12", and the "General Provisions for Monitoring and Reporting," and future revisions thereto, as specified by the Executive Officer.
- 3. The discharger shall file with this Board a report of any material change or proposed change in the character, location or quantity of waste discharged. For the purpose of these requirements, this includes any proposed change in the boundaries or contours of the disposal site.
- 4. Ninety (90) days prior to discontinuing the use of this site for waste disposal, the discharger shall submit a technical report to the Board describing the methods and controls to be used to assure protection of the quality of surface and groundwaters of the area during final operations and with any proposed subsequent use of the land. This report shall be prepared by or under the supervision of a registered engineer or a certified engineering geologist. The method used to close the site and maintain protection of the quality of surface and groundwater shall comply with waste discharge requirements established by the Regional Board.
- 5. This Board considers the property owner to have a continuing responsibility for correcting any problems which may arise in the future as a result of this waste discharge or water applied to this property during subsequent use of the land for other purposes. In the event of any change in ownership of the disposal site, or change of operator, the County of Riverside Probation Department shall:
 - a. Notify this Board of such change; and

b. Notify the succeeding owner or operator of the existence of this Order by letter; a copy of which shall be filed with this Board.




