RESOLUTION NO. 77-72

EXPRESSING CONCERN OVER POTENTIAL ADVERSE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS FROM POTENTIALLY NOXIOUS AQUATIC SPECIES THAT MAY BE INTRODUCED INTO THE COLORADO RIVER FROM THE CHEMEHUEVI INDIAN TRIBE'S PROPOSED SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT

- WHEREAS, The Chemehuevi Indian Tribe has submitted information to the Regional Board indicating a desire to construct and cperate a sewage treatment plant for the treatment of wastewater on the Chemehuevi Indian Reservation adjacent to the Colorado River; and
- WHEREAS, Information concerning the project submitted to the Board by the Chemehuevi Indian Tribe and by its consultants indicates that potentially noxious aquatic species will be utilized within the treatment system; and
- WHEREAS, The Colorado River and its lakes and backwaters are benefically used for domestic, agricultural and industrial water supplies, freshwater wildlife habitat, recreation, and hydroelectric power generations; and
- WHEREAS, The introduction or escape of potentially noxious aquatic species into the Colorado River could adversely impact the beneficial uses of the Colorado River and its lakes and backwaters, and could increase the comsumptive water use; and
- WHEREAS, This Board's Regional Agricultural Water Quality Advisory Committee, at its meeting on June 29, 1977, reviewed available information concerning the proposed project and recommended that its expression of opposition to the use of potentially noxious aquatic species, be directed to the Regional Board; and
- WHEREAS, This Board's Regional Policy Advisory Committee at its meeting on June 30, 1977, reviewed available information concerning the proposed project and unanimously recommended that formal action be taken opposing the use of potentially noxious aquatic species near the Colorado River; and

- WHEREAS, The Imperial Dam Advisory Board, the Coachella Valley
 County Water District, the Imperial Irrigation District,
 the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California,
 the Wellton-Mohawk Irrigation and Drainage District, and
 the Arizona Water Commission, have adopted resolutions and/or
 submitted letters opposing the utilization of water hyacinths
 as a sewage treatment process, and have requested that
 an environmental evaluation of the proposal be made; and
 have directed these expressions to this Regional Board, to
 the State Water Resources Control Board, and to other
 interested agencies; and
- WHEREAS, An environmental assessment prepared by the Chemehuevi Tribe's consultants, concluded that the project will result in no significant adverse environmental effects outside of the immediate area of the treatment plant, but did not address potential environmental impacts that may result from introduction of potentially noxious aquatic species into the Colorado River; and
- WHEREAS, No Environmental Impact Report or Environmental Impact
 Statement has been prepared and reviewed for the proposed
 project; now, therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region, expresses its concern over adverse environmental impacts that may result from the use of potentially noxious aquatic species that could escape or otherwise be introduced into the Colorado River from the Chemehuevi Indian Tribe's proposes sewage treatment plant; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That this Regional Board requests of the United States
 Economic Development Administration, the United States
 Environmental Protection Agency, and the State Water
 Resources Control Board that consideration of funding of
 the Chemehuevi Indian Tribe's proposed sewage treatment
 plant include the development of a environmental study and
 report, and that copies of the report be forwarded to all
 interested agencies and persons, with at least 30 days time
 for review and comment; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That this Regional Board offers the services of its Executive Officer to work with other interested agencies and persons towards an adequate resolution of this water quality problem; and be it further

RESOLVED, That certified copies of this Board's resolution be forwarded to the United States Economic Development Administration, the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the State Water Resources Control Board, the Chemehuevi Tribal Council, to other interested agencies and persons, and to others who may request same.
