ORDER NO. 78-49

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS  
FOR  
SANDBAR TRAILER PARK  
Palo Verde - Imperial County

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region, finds that:

1. Mr. & Mrs. C. Illingsworth, 2181 Pacific Ave., Costa Mesa, California 92627, submitted a Report of Waste Discharge dated February 18, 1978. Mr. & Mrs. Craig Chute, P.O. Box 720, Palo Verde, California 92266, operators of Sandbar Trailer Park, are also owners. Therefore, hereinafter both of the above parties are jointly referred to as the discharger.
2. The discharger is discharging an average of 7,000 gallons-per-day of domestic sewage from a mobile home park consisting of 23 mobile home spaces and two restrooms. The discharger proposes to add 39 mobile home spaces, producing a total discharge of 14,000 gallons-per-day. The wastewater is to be disposed of by means of septic tanks and leach fields located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 2, T9S, R21E, SBB&M.
3. The discharger has reserved areas of sufficient size for 100% replacement of each of the leach fields. These areas are designated on Attachment "A" incorporated herein and made a part of this Order.
4. The discharger states that groundwater depth is at least 10 feet in the areas designated for subsurface disposal.
5. The Water Quality Control Plan for the East Colorado River Basin was adopted by the Board on April 10, 1975. The Basin Plan contains water quality objectives for Colorado Hydrologic Unit and also specifies that subsurface sewage disposal facilities shall not be installed closer than 200 feet laterally from the high-water line of surface water used for water-contact sports.

7. The beneficial uses of the groundwaters of the Colorado Hydrologic Unit are:
  - a. Municipal supply
  - b. Industrial supply
  - c. Agricultural supply
8. The Imperial County Planning Department has prepared Negative Declaration EA 742-78 (filing date February 13, 1978) for the proposed expansion of this mobile home park. This assessment states that this project will not have any significant adverse effects on the environment.
9. The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to prescribe waste discharge requirements for the discharge.
10. The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharge.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the discharger shall comply with the following:


A. Discharge Specifications

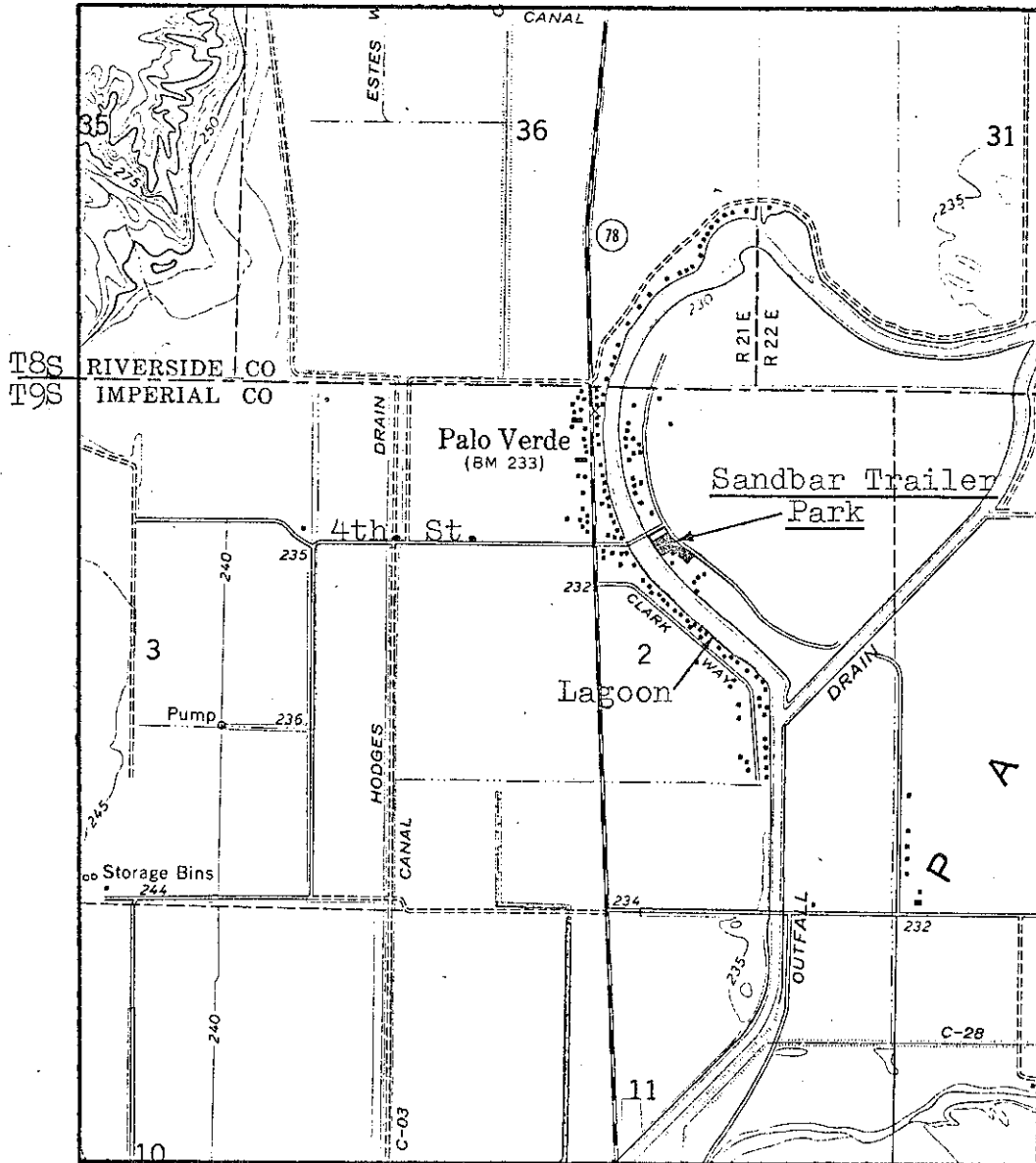
1. Neither the treatment nor the discharge of wastewater shall create a pollution or a nuisance as defined in Division 7 of the California Water Code.
2. No wastewater other than domestic sewage shall be discharged at this location.
3. Wastewater discharged subsurface shall be retained underground with no surfacing.
4. There shall be no installation of sewage treatment facilities within 200 feet laterally from the regulated high-water line of the Palo Verde Lagoon.
5. Adequate measures shall be taken to assure that flood or surface drainage waters do not erode or otherwise render portions of the discharge facilities inoperable.
6. Septic tank cleanings shall be discharged only by a duly authorized service.

## B. Provisions

1. The areas reserved for 100% replacement of the leach fields, as shown on Attachment "A" shall at all times be retained servient to this mobile home park, for the purpose of providing additional subsurface sewage disposal capacity, until such time as this park is connected to a municipal sewerage system.
2. Upon request from this Board's Executive Officer, the discharger shall furnish technical and/or monitoring reports on the treatment and discharge of waste.
3. Prior to any modifications in this facility which would result in material change in the quality or quantity of wastewater discharged, or any material change in location of discharge, the discharger shall report in writing to the Regional Board.
4. Prior to any future change of ownership of this mobile home park, the discharger shall:
  - a. Specify as a condition of transfer that said sewage disposal area must remain servient to the park, for the purpose of providing additional subsurface sewage disposal capacity, until such time as this park is connected to a municipal sewerage system.
  - b. Notify the succeeding owner, in writing, of the existence of this Order, and forward a copy of said correspondence to the Regional Board.

SITE MAP

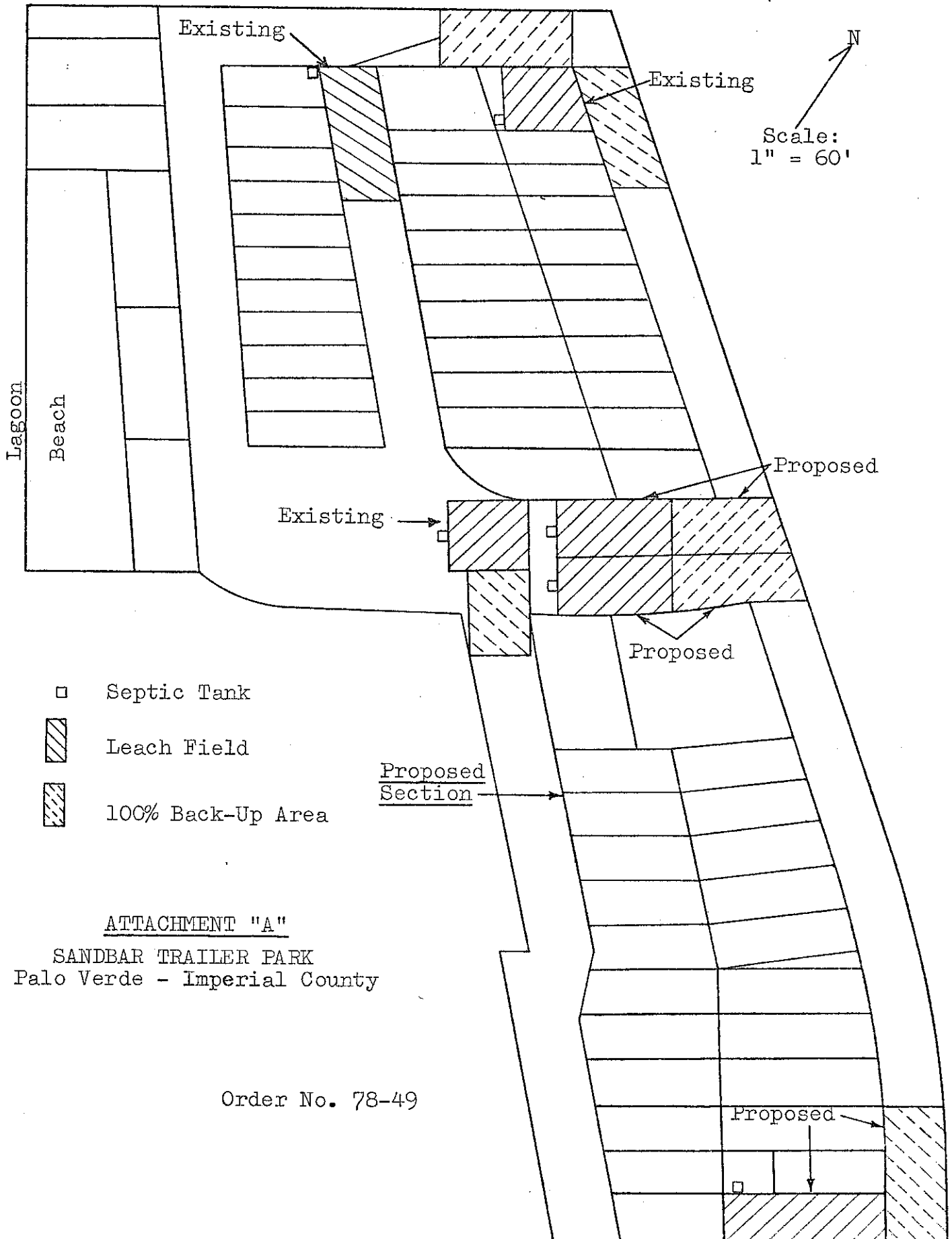
SANDBAR TRAILER PARK
