#### ORDER NO. 78-82

#### WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR

"KOA" KAMPGROUNDS OF AMERICA, PHASE I ... Joshua Tree - San Bernardino County

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region, Finds that:

- Charles Hirtle (hereinafter also referred to as the discharger), P.O. Box 788, Yucca Valley, CA 92284, submitted a Report of Waste Discharge dated July 11, 1978.
- 2. The discharger proposes to discharge an average of 12,000 gallons-per-day of domestic sewage from the first phase of a recreational vehicle campground. Phase I has been designed to have 104 recreational vehicle spaces, 2 restrooms and a swimming pool. The sewage is to be discharged into a septic tank/ leach field system, situated in the  $N\frac{1}{2}$  of the SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of Section 30, TIN, R7E, SBB&M.
- 3. The discharger has reserved an area of sufficient size for 100% replacement of the disposal field. This area is designated on Attachment "A" incorporated herein and made a part of this Order.
- 4. The discharger proposes to discharge wastewater from a swimming pool into a separate seepage pit.
- 5. The Water Quality Control Plan for the West Colorado River Basin was adopted by the Board on April 10, 1975. The Basin Plan contains water quality objectives for the Joshua Tree Hydrologic Unit.
- 6. The beneficial uses of the groundwater of the Joshua Tree Hydrologic Unit are:

a. Municipal supply

b. Industrial supply

- 7. The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to prescribe waste discharge requirements for the proposed discharge.
- 8. The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertaining to the proposed discharge.
- 9. The San Bernardino County Environmental Analysis Division has prepared Negative Declaration EAD No. 78E-0134 (effective date May 2, 1978) for this proposed recreational vehicle park. This assessment states that this project would not have a significant effect on the environment.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the discharger shall comply with the following:

- A. Discharge Specifications
  - 1. Neither the treatment nor the discharge of wastewater shall create a pollution or a nuisance as defined in Division 7 of the California Water Code.
  - 2. No wastewater other than domestic sewage and swimming pool wastewater shall be discharged at this location.
  - 3. Wastewater discharged subsurface shall be retained underground with no surfacing.
  - 4. There shall be no discharge of sewage within 200 feet of any domestic water well.
  - 5. Adequate measures shall be taken to assure that flood or surface drainage waters do not erode or otherwise render portions of the discharge facilities inoperable.
  - 6. Septic tank cleanings shall be discharged only by a duly authorized service.
  - 7. Swimming pool wastewater shall not be discharged into a sewage disposal system.

## B. Provisions

1. The area reserved for 100% replacement of the leach field, as shown on Attachment "A", shall at all times be retained servient to this recreational vehicle park, for the purpose of providing additional subsurface sewage disposal capacity, until such time as this park is connected to a municipal sewerage system.



- 2. Upon request from this Board's Executive Officer, the discharger shall furnish technical and/or monitoring reports on the treatment and discharge of waste.
- 3. Prior to any modifications in this facility which would result in material change in the quality or quantity of wastewater discharged, or any material change in location of discharge, the discharger shall report in writing to the Regional Board.
- 4. Prior to any future change of ownership of this recreational vehicle park, the discharger shall:
  - a. Specify as a condition of transfer that said sewage disposal areas must remain servient to the park, for the purpose of providing subsurface sewage disposal capacity, until such time as this park is connected to a municipal sewerage system.
  - b. Notify the succeeding owner, in writing, of the existence of this Order, and forward a copy of said correspondence to the Regional Board.
- 5. This Order is for the discharge of domestic sewage and swimming pool wastewater from the first phase of this recreational vehicle park. Prior to commencement of construction of an additional phase of the park, the discharger shall submit a report of waste discharge to the Regional Board.

SITE MAP


