## ORDER NO. 78-92 (Revised) NPDES No. CA 0104388

## WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR CITY OF INDIO - NORTH JACKSON SWIMMING POOL Riverside County

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region, finds that:

- The City of Indio (hereinafter also referred to as the discharger), 100 Civic Center Mall, Indio, California 92201, submitted an NPDES Application for Permit to Discharge, dated July 25, 1978. Said application is assigned Application No. CA 0104388.
- 2. The discharger presently discharges an average flow of 5000 gallons-per-operating-day of swimming pool filter backwash water into a storm sewer which empties into Coachella Valley Storm Water Channel at River Mile 18.75 in the NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of the SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of Section 14, T5S, R7E, SBB&M.
- 3. The discharge from this swimming pool has been subject to waste discharge requirements adopted in Board Order No. 74-2, and subsequently in Order No. 78-92 (NPDES No. CA 0104388).
- 4. The Water Quality Control Plan for the West Colorado River Basin was adopted by the Board on April 10, 1975. The Basin Plan contains water quality objectives for the Coachella Valley Storm Water Channel.
- 5. Beneficial uses of the water of Coachella Valley Storm Water Channel, which are to be protected by this Order, are as follows:
  - a. Transport of dissolved solids to Salton Sea for agricultural soil salinity control.
  - b. Freshwater replenishment for Salton Sea.
  - c. Warm freshwater habitat for fish and wildlife.

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d. Recreation - nonwater contact.

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- 6. The discharge is a "minor discharge" as defined in Section 2235(e) of Chapter 3, Title 23 of the California Administrative Code, and is not of a category for which effluent limitations, standards of performance, or toxic and pretreatment effluent standards have been promulgated pursuant to Sections 301, 302, 306, and 307 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act.
- 7. The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to revise waste discharge requirements for the discharge, and has provided them with an opportunity for a public hearing and an opportunity to submit their written views and recommendations.
- 8. The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharge.
- 9. The issuance of waste discharge requirements for this discharge is exempt from the provisions of Chapter 3 (commencing with Section 21000) of Division 13 of the Public Resources Code in accordance with Water Code Section 13389.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the discharger pursuant to the provisions of Division 7 of the California Water Code and regulations adopted thereunder, and to the provisions of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act as amended and regulations and guidelines adopted thereunder, shall comply with the following:

- A. Discharge Limitations
  - 1. The discharge shall be limited to wastewater of the quantity and type described in Finding No. 2 (above).
  - 2. Neither the treatment nor the discharge of wastewater shall create a pollution or a nuisance as defined in Division 7 of the California Water Code.
  - 3. The discharge shall not cause a violation of any applicable water quality standard for receiving waters adopted by the Board or the State Water Resources Control Board as required by the Federal Water Pollution Control Act and regulations adopted thereunder. If more stringent applicable water quality standards are promulgated or approved pursuant to Section 303 of the FWPCA or amendments thereto, the Board may revise and modify this Order in accordance with such more stringent standards.

### B. Provisions

1. This Order includes the attached "Standard Provisions".


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- Prior to any modifications in this facility which would 3. result in material change in the quality or quantity of wastewater discharged, or any material change in location of discharge, the discharger shall report in writing to the Regional Board.
- In the event of any change in operation, or in control or ownership of land or waste disposal facilities 4. owned or controlled by the discharger, the discharger shall:
  - a. Notify this Board of such change; and
  - Notify the succeeding owner or operator by letter b. of the existence of this Order, a copy of which shall be filed with this Board.
- 5. This Order expires on November 15, 1983. The discharger must file a Report of Waste Discharge in accordance with Title 23, Chapter 3, Subchapter 9 of the California Administrative Code not later than 180 days in advance of such expiration date as application for issuance of new waste discharge requirements.
- 6. The discharger shall file with the Board a report of waste discharge at least 120 days before making any material change in the character, location, or volume of the discharge.
- This Order supersedes Board Order No. 74-2, and also 7. Order No. 78-92 (NPDES No. CA 0104388).
- 8. This Order shall serve as a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit pursuant to Section 402 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, or amendments thereto, and shall take effect at the end of ten days from date of hearing provided the Regional Administrator, Environmental Protection Agency, has no objections.

#### Waste Discharge Requirements For

CITY OF INDIO - NORTH JACKSON SWIMMING POOL Riverside County

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region, finds that:

- The City of Indio (hereinafter also referred to as the discharger), 100 Civic Center Mall, Indio, California 92201, submitted an NPDES Application For Permit To Discharge, dated July 25, 1978. Said application is assigned Application Number CA 0104388.
- 2. The discharger presently discharges an average flow of 5000 gallons-per-operating-day of swimming pool filter backwash water into a storm sewer which empties into Coachella Valley Storm Water Channel at River Mile 18.75 in the NE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 14, T5S, R7E, SBB&M.
- 3. The discharge from this swimming pool has been subject to waste discharge requirements adopted in Board Order No. 74-2.
- 4. The Water Quality Control Plan for the West Colorado River Basin was adopted by the Board on April 10, 1975. The Basin Plan contains water quality objectives for the Coachella Valley Storm Water Channel.
- 5. Water in the Coachella Valley Storm Water Channel discharges to Salton Sea, and thereby serves as a freshwater replenishment to that body of water.
- 6. The discharge is a "minor discharge" as defined in Section 2235(e) of Chapter 3, Title 23 of the California Administrative Code, and is not of a category for which effluent limitations, standards of performance, or toxic and pretreatment effluent standards have been promulgated pursuant to Sections 301, 302, 306, and 307 of the Federal Nater Pollution Control Act.

- 7. The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to update waste discharge requirements for the discharge, and has provided them with an opportunity for a public hearing and an opportunity to submit their written views and recommendations.
- 8. The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharge.
- 9. The issuance of waste discharge requirements for this discharge is exempt from the provisions of Chapter 3 (commencing with Section 21000) of Division 13 of the Public Resources Code in accordance with Water Code Section 13389.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the discharger pursuant to the provisions of Division 7 of the California Water Code and regulations adopted thereunder, and to the provisions of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act as amended and regulations and guidelines adopted thereunder, shall comply with the following:

A. Discharge Limitations

- 1. The discharge shall be limited to wastewater of the quantity and type described in Finding No. 2(above).
- 2. Neither the treatment nor the discharge of wastewater shall create a pollution or a nuisance as defined in Division 7 of the California Water Code.
- 3. The discharge shall not cause a violation of any applicable water quality standard for receiving waters adopted by the Board or the State Water Resources Control Board as required by the Federal Water Pollution Control Act and regulations adopted thereunder. If more stringent applicable water quality standards are promulgated or approved pursusant to Section 303 of the FWPCA or amendments thereto, the Board may revise and modify this Order in accordance with such more stringent standards.

#### B. Provisions

- 1. This Order includes the attached "Standard Provisions".
- 2. Upon request from this Board's Executive Officer, the discharger shall furnish technical and/or monitoring reports on the treatment and discharge of waste.


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- 3. Prior to any modifications in this facility which would result in material change in the quality or quantity of wastewater discharged, or any material change in location of discharge, the discharger shall report in writing to the Regional Board.
- 4. In the event of any change in operation, or in control or ownership of land or waste disposal facilities owned or controlled by the discharger, the discharger shall:
  - a. Notify this Board of such change; and
  - b. Notify the succeeding owner or operator by letter of the existence of this Order, a copy of which shall be filed with this Board.
- 5. This Order expires on November 15, 1983. The discharger must file a Report of Waste Discharge in accordance with Title 23, Chapter 3, Subchapter 9 of the California Administrative Code not later than 180 days in advance of such expiration date as application for issuance of new waste discharge requirements.
- 6. The discharger shall file with the Board a report of waste discharge at least 120 days before making any material change in the character, location, or volume of the discharge.
- 7. This Order supersedes Board Order No. 74-2.
- 8. This Order shall serve as a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit pursuant to Section 402 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, or amendments thereto, and shall take effect at the end of ten days from date of hearing provided the Regional Administrator, Environmental Protection Agency, has no objections.

## STANDARD PROVISIONS FOR MINOR DISCHARGES

- 1. The discharger shall permit the Regional Board:
  - (a) Entry upon premises in which an effluent source is located or in which any required records are kept;
  - (b) Access at reasonable times to copy any records required to be kept under terms and conditions of this Order;
  - (c) Inspection at reasonable times of monitoring equipment or records, and
  - (d) Sampling at reasonable times of any discharge.
- 2. All discharges authorized by this Order shall be consistent with the terms and conditions of this Order. The discharge of any pollutant more frequently than or at a level in excess of that identified and authorized by this Order shall constitute a violation of the terms and conditions of this Order.
- 3. The discharger shall maintain in good working order and operate as efficiently as possible any facility or control system installed by the discharger to achieve compliance with the waste discharge requirements.
- 4. After notice and opportunity for a hearing, this Order may be terminated or modified for cause, including, but not limited to:
  - (a) Violation of any term or condition contained in this Order;
  - (b) Obtaining this Order by misrepresentation, or failure to disclose fully all relevant facts;
    - c) A change in any condition that requires either a temporary or permanent reduction or elimination of the authorized discharge.
- 5. If a toxic effluent standard or prohibition (including any schedule of compliance specified in such effluent standard or prohibition) is established under Section 307(a) of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, or amendments thereto, for a toxic pollutant which is present in the discharge authorized herein and such standard or prohibition is more

stringent than any limitation upon such pollutant in this Order, the Board will revise or modify this Order in accordance with such toxic effluent standard or prohibition and so notify the discharger.

6. In the event of any change in control or ownership of land . or waste discharge facilities presently owned or controlled by the discharger, the discharger shall notify the succeeding owner or operator of the existence of this Order by a letter, a copy of which shall be forwarded to the Board.

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
