ORDER NO. 78-94

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS
FOR
HAVASU PALMS MOBILE HOME AND RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARK
Lake Havasu - San Bernardino County

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region, finds that:

1. Havasu Palms, Inc., P.O. Box 78, Parker Dam, CA 92367, provided updated information on August 10, 1978, on the discharge of wastes.
2. The discharger is discharging a maximum of 20,000 gallons-per-day of domestic sewage from a mobile home and recreational vehicle park consisting of 92 mobile home spaces, 29 recreational vehicle spaces, 2 restrooms and a laundry room. Sewage is routed through septic tanks and then pumped to oxidation basins located in the NE 1/4 of Section 31, T4N, R26E, SBB&M.
3. The discharge from this mobile home and recreational vehicle park has been subject to waste discharge requirements adopted in Board Order No. 72-89.
4. The Water Quality Control Plan for the East Colorado River Basin was adopted by the Board on April 10, 1975. The Basin Plan contains water quality objectives for Chemehuevi Hydrologic Unit.
5. The beneficial uses of the ground waters of the Chemehuevi Hydrologic Unit are:
 - a. Domestic supply
 - b. Agricultural supply
6. The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to update waste discharge requirements for the discharge.
7. The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharge.

8. This mobile home and recreational vehicle park constitutes an ongoing project in accordance with provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.) and the State Guidelines because the governmental approvals on or after April 5, 1973, do not involve a greater degree of responsibility or control over such activity than the governmental approvals received prior to that date.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the discharger shall comply with the following:

A. Discharge Specifications


1. Neither the treatment nor the discharge of wastewater shall create a pollution or a nuisance as defined in Division 7 of the California Water Code.
2. No wastewater other than domestic sewage shall be discharged into the sewage disposal system described in Finding No. 2 (above).
3. A minimum depth of freeboard of at least two feet shall be maintained in the earthen basins.
4. Treated or untreated sludge, or similar solid waste materials, shall be disposed of in such manner that these materials shall not enter the Colorado River or any channel which drains to the River.
5. Adequate measures shall be taken to assure that unauthorized persons and animal pets are effectively excluded from contact with the discharge.
6. Adequate measures shall be taken to assure that flood or surface drainage waters do not erode or otherwise render portions of the discharge facilities inoperable.
7. There shall be no surface flow of wastewater away from the discharge facilities.
8. There shall be no discharge, bypass, or flow of treated or untreated sewage to the Colorado River, or to any channel which drains to said River.
9. Facilities shall be available to handle wastewater in the event of commercial power failure.
10. Septic tank cleanings shall be discharged only by a duly authorized service.

11. There shall be no discharge of any water softener brines at the park, except to impervious containers from which there is no seepage or overflow, and said brines shall be periodically discharged at a disposal site approved by the Regional Board to receive these wastes.
12. Oxidation-infiltration facilities shall be maintained and operated so as to maximize infiltration and minimize the increase in salinity of the wastewater discharge.
13. There shall be no sewage disposal facilities within 200 feet laterally from the regulated high-water line of the Colorado River or within 200 feet of any domestic water well.

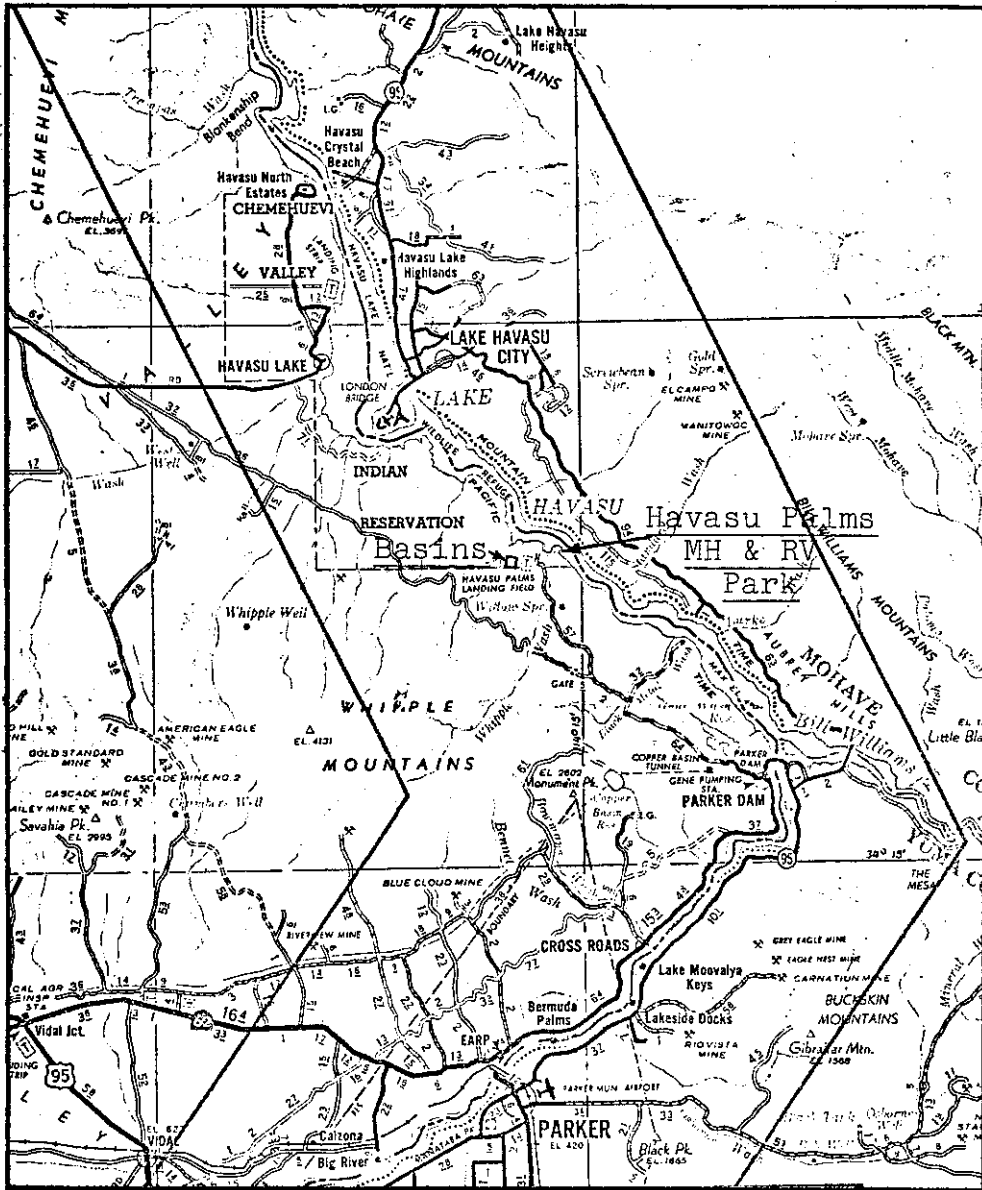
B. Provisions

1. Prior to any material change in the quality or quantity of wastewater discharged, or any material change in location of discharge, the discharger shall report thereon to the Board.
2. Upon request from this Board's Executive Officer, the discharger shall furnish technical and/or monitoring reports on the treatment and discharge of wastes.
3. In the event of any change in operation, or in control or ownership of land or waste disposal facilities owned or controlled by the discharger, the discharger shall:
 - a. Notify this Board of such change; and
 - b. Notify the succeeding owner or operator by letter of the existence of this Order, a copy of which shall be filed with this Board.
4. This Order supersedes Board Order No. 72-89.

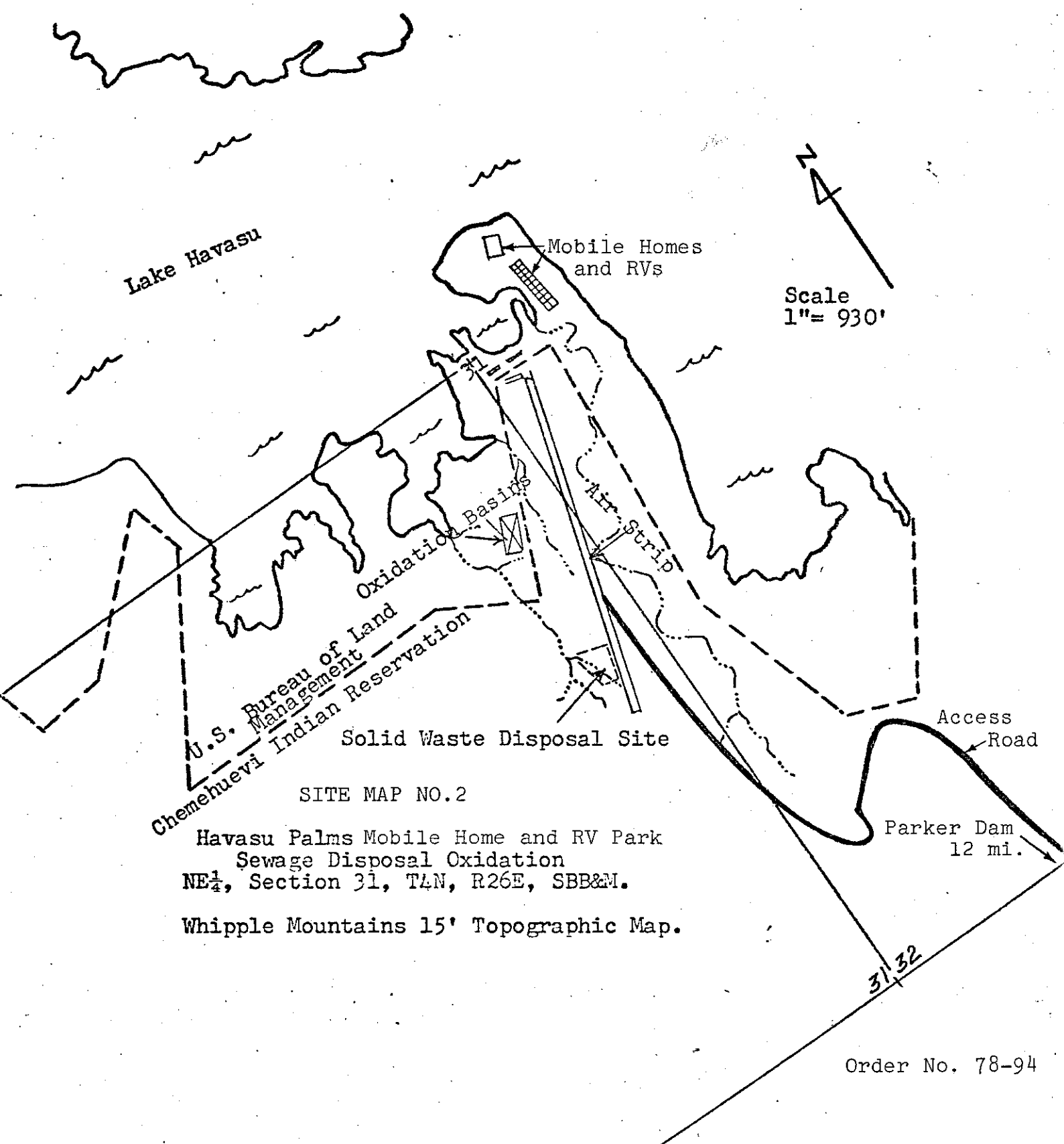


SITE MAP NO. 1
