ORDER NO. 79-21

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR

CANDLEWOOD VILLAGE, TRACT NO. 13668 Southeast of Palm Springs - Riverside County

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region, finds that:

- 1. Donald G. Scanlin Enterprises, Inc. (hereinafter also referred to as the discharger), 500 Esplanade Dr., Suite 1470, Oxnard, CA 93030, submitted a Report of Waste Discharge, dated November 16, 1978.
- 2. The discharger proposes to discharge a design flow of 22,000 gallons-per-day of domestic sewage from a 75-unit condominium complex. The wastewater is to be discharged into septic tank/seepage pit disposal systems located in the SE_4^1 of Section 29, T4S, R5E, SBB&M.
- 3. The discharger reports that the nearest sewer line is approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ mile northwest of the project on Golf Club Drive within Palm Springs City Limits.
- 4. The discharger is reserving areas of sufficient size for possible future 100 percent replacement of each of the seepage pits.
- 5. The discharger states that wastewater from a swimming pool and a hot pool is to be periodically discharged into a separate seepage pit.
- 6. There are no domestic wells within 200 feet of the proposed discharge facilities described in Findings No. 2, 4, and 5 (above).
- 7. The Water Quality Control Plan for the West Colorado River Basin was adopted by the Board on April 10, 1975. The Basin Plan contains water quality objectives for the Coachella Hydrologic Subunit.
 - 8. The beneficial uses of the groundwater of the Coachella Hydrologic Subunit are:
 - a. Municipal supply
 - b. Industrial supply
 - c. Agricultural supply


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9. The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to prescribe waste discharge requirements for the proposed discharge. 10 The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertaining to the proposed discharge The Riverside County Planning Department has prepared Negative Declaration EA 101 - 90 (filing date 11. January 10, 1979) for this proposed condominum complex. The Regional Board has reviewed this Negative Declaration and has determined that this project will not have any significant adverse effects on water quality. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the discharger shall comply with the following: Discharge Specifications Α. Neither the treatment nor the discharge of wastewater shall create a pollution or a nuisance as defined in Division 7 of the California Water Code. No wastewater other than domestic sewage and swimming pool and hot pool wastewater shall be discharged at this location. Wastewater discharged subsurface shall be retained underground with no surfacing. Adequate measures shall be taken to assure that flood or surface drainage waters do not erode or otherwise render portions of the discharge facilities inoperable. Septic tank cleaning shall be discharged only by a duly 5. authorized service. Swimming pool and hot pool wastewater shall not be discharged into a sewage disposal system. Provisions В. Sufficient land area shall be reserved for possible future 100 percent replacement of the seepage pits, until such time as this park is connected to a municipal sewerage system.

- 2. The subsurface sewerage system should be designed and constructed to facilitate possible connection to the City of Palm Springs community sewerage system when capacity is available.
- 3. Upon request from this Board's Executive Officer, the discharger shall furnish technical and/or monitoring reports on the treatment and discharge of waste.
- 4. Prior to any modifications in this facility which would result in material change in the quality or quantity of wastewater discharged, or any material change in location of discharge, the discharger shall report in writing to the Regional Board.
- 5. Prior to any change of ownership of this condominium complex, the discharger shall:
 - a. Specify as a condition of transfer that said sewage disposal areas must remain servient to the condominiums, for the purpose of providing subsurface sewage disposal capacity, until such time as this complex is connected to a municipal sewerage system.
 - b. Notify the succeeding owner, in writing, of the existence of this Order, and forward a copy of said correspondence to the Regional Board
