
CALIFORNIA REGIONAL WATER QUALITY CONTROL BOARD COLORADO RIVER BASIN REGION ORDER NO. 79-95 WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR CAMP OAKES Southeast of Big Bear - San Bernardino County The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region, finds that: YMCA Camp of Long Beach (hereinafter also referred to as the discharger) P.O. Box 452, Big Bear City, CA 92314, submitted a Report of Waste Discharge dated August 7, 1979. The discharger is discharging an average of 9,000 gallonsper-day of domestic sewage from a youth camp having 21 dormitories, 6 cabins, 6 restrooms, a dining hall and an infirmary. An additional 2 domitories and a restroom are proposed, which would produce a total maximum discharge of 10,000 gallons-per-day. Wastewater is disposed by means of septic tank/leach field disposal systems located in the NE \(\frac{1}{4}\) of Section 27, T2N, R2E, SBB&M. The discharger is reserving areas of sufficient size for 3. possible future 100 percent replacement of the leach fields. 4. There are no domestic water wells within 200 feet of the discharge facilities described in Findings No. 2 and 3 above. The Water Quality Control Plan for the West Colorado River Basin was adopted by the Board on April 10, 1975. The Basin Plan contains water quality objectives for the Johnson Hydrologic Unit. The beneficial uses of the groundwaters of the Johnson Hydrologic Unit are: Municipal supply a. b. Industrial supply c. Agricultural supply The Board has notified the discharger and interested agencies and persons of its intent to prescribe waste discharge requirements for the discharge. Concelled by 81-25 -1-

8. The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertaining to the discharge. 9. This youth camp constitutes an ongoing project in accordance with provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.) and Title 23, California Administrative Code, Chapter 3, Subchapter 17, Section 2715, because the governmental approvals on or after April 1973, do not involve a greater degree of responsibility or control over such activity than the governmental approvals received prior to that date. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the discharger shall comply with the following: A. Discharge Specifications Neither the treatment nor the discharge of wastewater shall create a pollution or a nuisance as defined in Division 7 of the California Water Code. 2. No wastewater other than domestic sewage shall be discharged at this location. Wastewater discharged subsurface shall be retained underground with no surfacing. 4. Adequate measures shall be taken to assure that flood or surface drainage waters do not erode or otherwise render portions of the discharge facilities inoperable. Septic tank cleanings shall be discharged only by a duly authorized service. В. Provisions Sufficient land area shall be reserved for possible future 100 percent replacement of the leach fields, until such time as this camp is connected to a municipal sewerage system. Upon request from this Board's Executive Officer, the discharger shall furnish technical and/or monitoring reports on the treatment and discharge of wastes. Prior to any modifications in this facility which would result in material change in the quality or quantity of wastewater discharged, or any material change in location of discharge, the discharger shall report in writing to the Regional Board. - 2 -

4. Prior to any change of ownership of this youth camp, the discharger shall: Specify as a condition of transfer that the area specified in Provision B.1 (above) remain servient to the camp, for the purpose of providing additional subsurface sewage disposal capacity until such time as this camp is connected to a municipal sewerage system. Notify the succeeding owner, in writing, of the existence of this Order, and forward a copy of said correspondence to the Regional Board. I. 
