

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, the discharger shall comply with the following:

A. Discharge Specifications


1. The treatment or disposal of wastes shall not cause pollution or a nuisance as defined in Section 13050 (l) and 13050 (m) of the California Water Code.
2. The discharger shall not discharge pesticides, fuels, chemical or other industrial wastes into the disposal system, and shall inform the Regional Board immediately of any commercial or industrial waste discharged.
3. A minimum depth of freeboard of at least two feet shall be maintained in evaporation basins.
4. Treated or untreated sludge, or similar solid animal waste materials, shall be disposed in such manner that these materials shall not enter Alamo River or any channel which will drain to the River.
5. Adequate measures shall be taken to assure that unauthorized persons and animal pets are effectively excluded from contact with the discharge.
6. Adequate measures shall be taken to assure that flood or surface drainage waters do not erode or otherwise render portions of the discharge facilities inoperable.
7. There shall be no discharge, by-pass, or flow of wastewater to Alamo River or to any channel which drains to said River.

B. Provisions

1. Prior to any modifications in this facility which could result in material change in the quality or quantity or wastewater discharged, or any material change in location of discharge, the discharger shall report thereon to the Board.
2. Upon request from this Board's Executive Officer, the discharger shall furnish technical and/or monitoring reports on the treatment and discharge of wastes.
3. In the event of any change in operation, or in control or ownership of land and/or waste disposal facilities owned or controlled by the discharger, the discharger shall:
 - a. Notify this Board of such change; and
 - b. Notify the succeeding owner or operator by letter of the existence of this Order, a copy of which shall be filed with this Board.

4. This Order supersedes Board Resolution No. 74-36.

WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS
FOR
JOHNSON HOGUE LIVESTOCK TRANSPORT
Holtville - Imperial County

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region, finds that:

1. Johnson Hogue Livestock Transport (hereinafter also referred to as the discharger), P. O. Box 488, Holtville, California 92250, submitted current information to update existing waste discharge requirements.
2. The discharger is currently discharging an average of 13,500 gallons-per-week of wastewater resulting from cattle truck cleaning operations and a small amount of tractor and truck steam cleaning. The wastewater is discharged via a ditch into two evaporation basins located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$, NW $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 36, T15S, R15E, SBB&M. This property is owned by Imperial Cotton Products, P. O. Box 266, Holtville, California 92250 and operated by Johnson Hogue Livestock Transport. The evaporation basins are periodically pumped out and the wastes are disposed on farmland for fertilizer.
3. The Water Quality Control Plan for the West Colorado River Basin was adopted on April 10, 1975. The Basin Plan contains water quality objectives for the Imperial Hydrologic Unit, and this Order implements those objectives.
4. Shallow ground waters at the site are saline and are not presently beneficially used.
5. This discharge has been subject to waste discharge requirements adopted in Board Order No. 74-36.
6. The Board has notified the discharger and interested persons and agencies of its intent to update waste discharge requirements for this site.
7. The Board in a public meeting heard and considered all comments pertaining to the existing discharge.
8. The disposal site constitutes an ongoing project in accordance with the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et. seq.), and Title 14, California Administrative Code, Article 6.5, Section 15070, because the governmental approvals on or after April 15, 1973 do not involve a greater degree of responsibility or control over such activity than the governmental approvals received prior to that date.

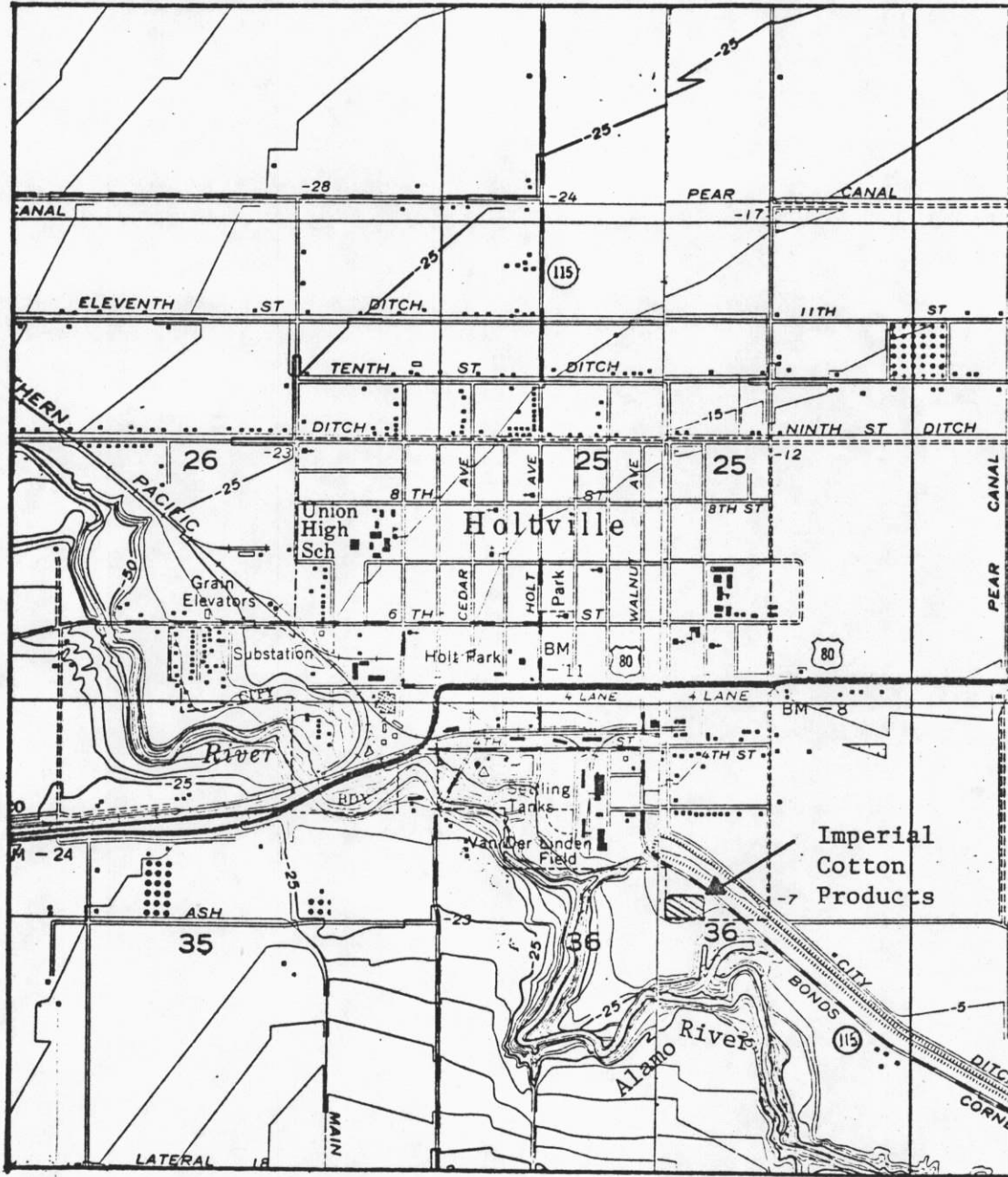
