ADMINISTRATIVE CIVIL LIABILITY ORDER NO. R7-2007-0011
ISSUED TO
HEBER PUBLIC UTILITY DISTRICT
FOR
DISCHARGES OF EFFLUENT THAT EXCEED THE EFFLUENT LIMITATIONS
OF THE CENTRAL DRAIN IN VIOLATION OF BOARD ORDER NO. 00-100
NPDES PERMIT NO. CA0104370

The Heber Public Utility District (Discharger) owns and operates a sewage collection and disposal system and provides sewerage service to the City of Heber. The wastewater treatment plant is designed to treat municipal wastewater flows of up to 0.810 million gallons per day. On September 13, 2000, the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region (Regional Board) adopted Waste Discharge Requirements, and a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit to regulate the discharge of treated municipal wastewater to the Central Drain 3-D No. 1. The Permit is assigned NPDES Permit No. CA0104370, Board Order No. 00-100.

On September 29, 2006, the Assistant Executive Officer of the Regional Board issued Administrative Civil Liability Complaint No. R7-2006-0068 against the Discharger, alleging that it discharged wastewater that exceeded effluent limits set forth in Board Order No. 00-100. Pursuant to Section 13385 of the California Water Code, this complaint proposed that the Discharger pay nine thousand dollars (\$9,000) in mandatory minimum penalties for violations of specified effluent limitations.

Pursuant to California Water Code Section 13323(b), the Discharger was timely informed of its right to waive the public hearing that the Regional Board had scheduled for November 16, 2006, in the La Quinta City Council Chambers to consider this enforcement matter. Prior to that hearing, the Discharger agreed to waive its right to the hearing. The Discharger also submitted a settlement proposal that included an agreement to implement a compliance project, consistent with Section X of the Water Quality Enforcement Policy (Policy), which is designed to correct the violations in five years in lieu of payment of the proposed civil liability of \$9,000. The Policy was adopted by the State Water Resources Control Board on February 19, 2002, as Resolution No. 2002-0040, was approved by the Office of Administrative Law, and became effective on July 30, 2002. The public hearing was cancelled, however, due to the Regional Board's not being able to meet minimum quorum requirements. The Regional Board has rescheduled the public hearing as follows:

During the hearing, the public and any other person interested in this matter can provide the Regional Board with comments on this matter.

Because the Discharger previously agreed to waive its right to a public hearing on this matter and to implement the compliance project proposed in lieu of payment of the proposed civil liability of \$9,000, the complaint. ACLC No. R7-2006-0068, was rescinded and a revised draft ACL Order, Board Order No. R7-2007-0011, was prepared reflecting this settlement. The Regional Board may still decide to conduct a hearing on this matter, however. The settlement of this Order will become final 30 days from the date of this Public Notice. Persons wishing to file written comments on, or objections to, the proposed Administrative Civil Liability Order or any other aspects of this matter are required to do so within 30 days of the date of this Public Notice so that the Regional Board may consider the comments.
