**NOTICE OF WRITTEN COMMENT PERIOD FOR PROPOSED SETTLEMENT
AGREEMENT AND STIPULATED ORDER**

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Region (Regional Water Board) is considering the adoption of a proposed Settlement Agreement and Stipulation for Entry of Administrative Civil Liability Order (Stipulated Order) No. R7-2021-0030. The Stipulated Order is a civil liability settlement between the Regional Water Board Prosecution Team and Lean Green Industries-Ins., LLC, (Discharger) (collectively, Parties) for an alleged violation of the State Water Resources Control Board, *General Waste Discharge Requirements and Waiver of Waste Discharge Requirements for Discharges of Waste Associated with Cannabis Cultivation Activities* (General Order). To resolve the alleged violation without an adjudicative proceeding, the Parties have agreed to administrative civil liability in the amount of \$35,000, calculated in accordance with the State Water Resources Control Board Water Quality Enforcement Policy.
