# NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

# PROPOSED UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CASE CLOSURE PURSUANT TO LOW-THREAT CLOSURE POLICY FOR

## RIVERSIDE COUNTY FORMER MECCA FIRE STATION NO. 40, 91100 FOURTH STREET, MECCA, RIVERSIDE COUNTY

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT** the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Colorado River Basin Region (Regional Water Board) will accept written comments on the proposed underground storage tank (UST) case closure for Former Mecca Fire Station No. 40, located in Mecca, GeoTracker Global ID No. T0606500985.

This UST site is being proposed for case closure pursuant to the State Water Resources Control Board's (State Water Board) Water Quality Control Policy for Low-Threat UST Case Closure (Low-Threat Closure Policy or Policy), adopted via Resolution No. 2012-0016 on August 17, 2012. In adopting this Policy, the State Water Board determined that certain UST cases are appropriate for closure if they pose a low threat to human health, safety, and the environment. Low threat is established under the Policy by demonstrating the UST case meets the general and media-specific criteria established in the Policy, satisfies the requirements of Health and Safety Code section 25296.10, and is consistent with State Water Board Resolution 92-49's requirement that cleanup goals and objectives be achieved within a reasonable time.

Regional Water Board UST Cleanup staff completed review of the case identified above, determined that the case meets the general and media-specific closure criteria of the Policy as well as complies with Health and Safety Code section 25296.10, State Water Board Resolution 92-49, and will make a recommendation to the Regional Water Board's Executive Officer for case closure. This recommendation is based upon the facts and circumstances of this UST case. The UST case record that is the basis for determining compliance with the Policy is available on the State Water Board's GeoTracker database at:

Pursuant to the Policy, the Regional Water Board is providing notice of the proposed UST case closure to: the responsible party, environmental consultant on record, municipal and county water districts, water replenishment districts, special act districts with groundwater management authority, local water purveyor, agencies authorized to issue building

permits for land affected by the petroleum release, owners and occupants of the property impacted by the petroleum release, and owners and occupants of all parcels adjacent to the impacted property, as applicable. This Notice will also be posted on the Regional Water Board's website.

### SUBMISSION OF WRITTEN COMMENTS

The Regional Water Board will accept written comments regarding the proposed case closure during a sixty (60) day public comment period, which begins **November 28, 2022**, and ends **January 30, 2023**. Persons wishing to submit written comments on the proposed case closure are requested to do so by **5:00 pm** on **January 30, 2023**, to be given sufficient consideration.
