CBA 2019 will feature a special workshop designed to understanding and improving the permitting process for organics projects in California. There will also be sessions addressing financial onramps for organics projects, incentives for certain bioresources technologies and products, distributed bioresources projects and community composting, and use of bioresources for energy and GHG reduction. Research Posters and Flash Presentations on new bioresources projects and technologies will also take place.

Participants include regulators and planners from all levels of government, industry representatives, researchers, environmental groups, and financiers. Bioresources encompasses manures, food waste, biosolids, green waste, agricultural wastes, and wood wastes.
